Topic Studies in Asian History: Introduction to Spatial History (E)

The course combines historical research and geographic information system (GIS) and introduces Spatial History as a concept and research method. The course discusses not only the paramount importance of space in history, but also the tools and technologies of the related research. Students will be given an opportunity to conceive and create their own spatial history projects, using the GIS and other related tools.

HIST 4406

Topic Studies in Cultural History: Catholic Sisters in Chinese Communities (E)

The course introduces the Catholic Sisters in Chinese communities, mainly in the twentieth century. It discusses the Sisters' work in education, welfare, and medical care. On the on hand, this course evaluates the contribution of the Sisters (Chinese and non-Chinese) in the local communities of Hong Kong. On the other hand, it assesses the perception of these Sisters from those people whom they had served. This course requires students to read quite an amount of materials so as to engage in group discussions.
