HISTORY

History Department Annual Assembly 2014



The Department of History held its first Annual Assembly on 6 Sep 2014 (Sat) at the Tsang Chan Sik Yue Auditorium (AAB201).

This was the first time that the Department attempted to gather all History majors enrolled in different teaching programmes, including the BA (Hons) in History, BSSc (Hons) in China Studies – History, BA (Hons) in History and BEd (Hons) in Liberal Studies Teaching, Diploma in Education (2+2) / (2+3), MSSc in Contemporary China Studies (History and Culture Concentration), M. Phil and PhD streams. Except one member who was participating in an overseas conference, all academic and teaching staff joined the assembly and met the students.

The Assembly began with a video clip which gave a general introduction of the History Department's development and achievements in the past 36 years and some students' achievements during the 2013/14 academic year. A report and preview of the current office renovation was also included.

She also took the chance to express her sincere thanks to the eight former Department Heads for their significant contributions to the growth of the Department. Professor Ho emphasized the importance of unity and she encouraged students to communicate and work closely with their teachers and classmates. Also, she announced that the Department will hold an annual assembly at the beginning of each academic year.

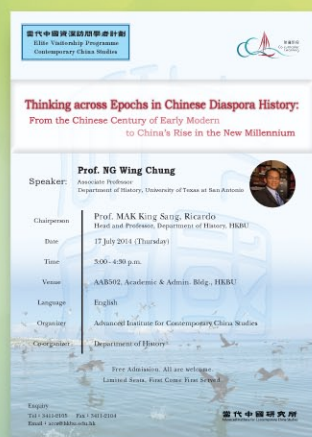

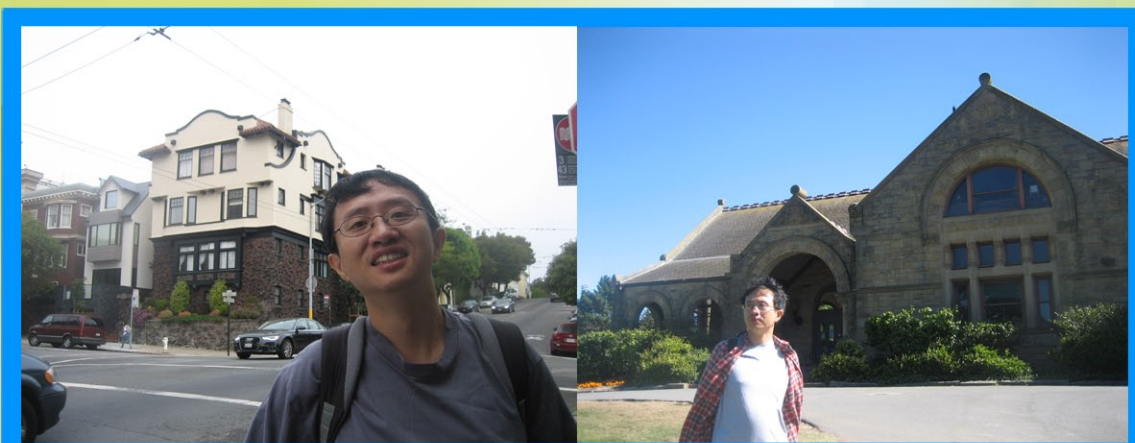
Dr. Guangxin FAN 范廣欣博士

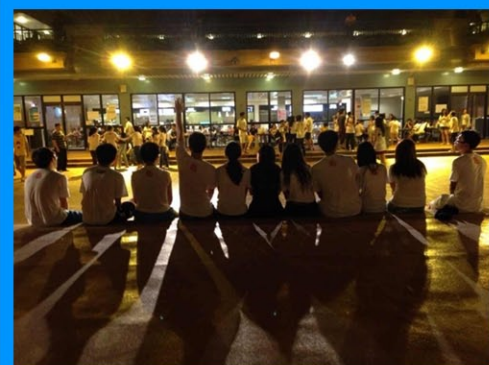

Prof. Clara Ho has asked me to update you on my activities and reflect on what my time at HKBU meant to me, so here goes. First I should say that my Fulbright year in Hong Kong was definitely a life-changing experience. Apart from the travel and making many new friends (and eating great food, of course), I learned so much. Teaching my American history class in Hong Kong helped me to update it and revise it in a way that was more student-friendly and I learned the best way to incorporate more images and clips into my lectures. My work on GE allowed me to immerse myself in the latest pedagogical research and to understand the joys and challenges of curriculum reform on a large scale. The work that Hong Kong universities have put into creating GE programs is truly impressive, and the result is a much more intentional program than most American schools have had.

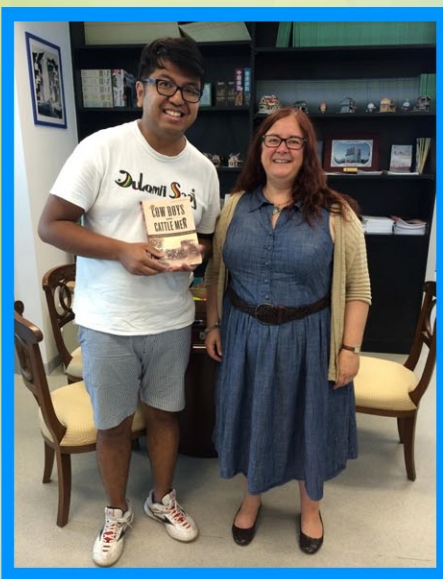
I spent the first year back regaling all my friends and colleagues about my wonderful



experiences. I also completely re-designed all my courses I taught to incorporate the best practices I had learned there. Austin College, like many liberal arts colleges in the United States, is now addressing the best ways to modernize their curriculum to prepare students for 21st century realities, and I have been able to make some good contributions to these discussions because of my work in Hong Kong. The experience has also helped prepare

me to enter into administrative work in the future. Last year, I was thrilled to host Prof. Ho on the Austin College campus to give a campus wide lecture on her research and a lecture in my Silk Road class on Chinese women's roles on the Silk Road. Both were very well received by students and faculty alike. The only sad part was that the pictures we took together were too blurry!!

Professionally, I continue to edit the African American History Series for Rowman and Littlefield, and we have published four new volumes since I was there. I also published an article based in part on talks I gave in Hong Kong about cowboy violence and masculinity. And finally, after five years I have finished the first full draft of the textbook resource I have been working on entitled *Issues and Controversies in Race and Civil Rights since 1865*. Since I started working on the project, the publishers, Facts on File, decided to make the *Issues and Controversies* series electronic online resources, and thus my 11 chapters (on topics ranging from "What was the best way for former slaves to achieve independence?" to "Was Barack Obama's election a turning point in race relations?") will now become part of their larger subscription data base, primarily as reference resources.



I was lucky to have the chance to visit Hong Kong again this summer but was only able to come in late July so unluckily I did not have a chance to see everyone again. However I had a very nice lunch with Prof. Ricardo Mak, a lovely dinner with Dr. Loretta Kim and her

family, and had a chance to catch up with Renee Chan and Crystal Poon in the History Department office. I also had a tour of the Center for Contemporary China Studies office from Laden Li and he very kindly asked me to sign a copy of my *Cow Boys and Cattle Men* book (and played the ukulele)! Thanks to everyone for being so welcoming, it makes me feel that HKBU is my second home!

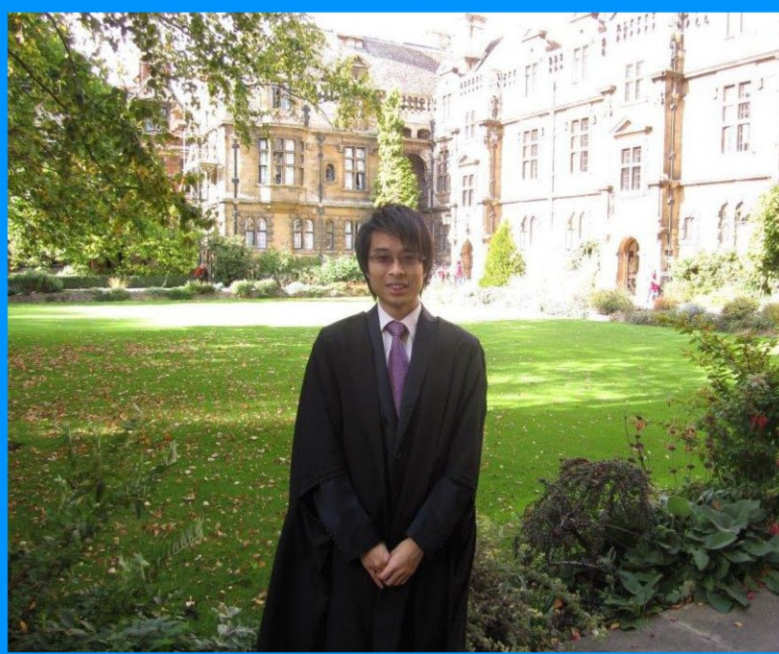
Hello my *shidime!*

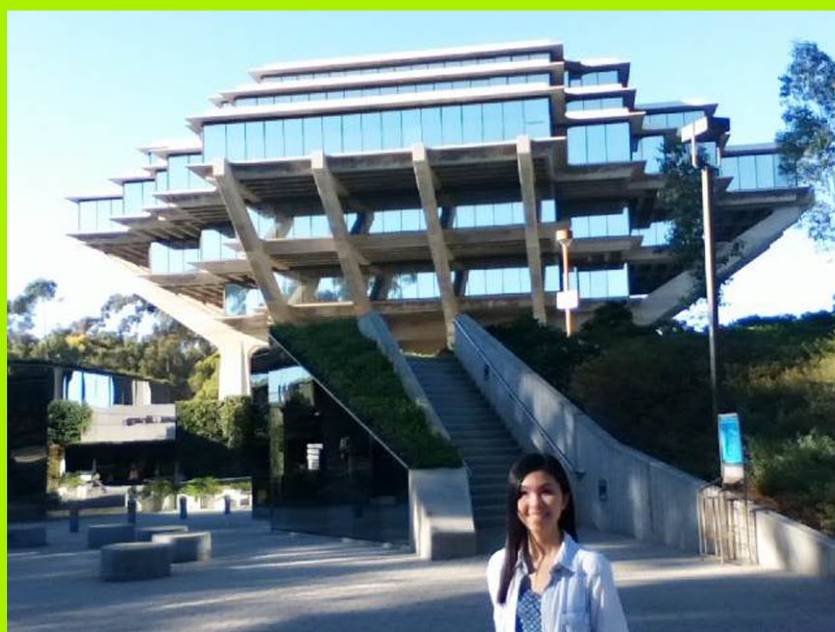
