## Message from the Head of Department

The History Department E-newsletter was launched in the fall of 2014. In the past two academic years, a total of 20 issues have been published. This form of monthly communication during terms has brought members of the History family much closer than before, and has also generated some interest in the general public. While we are happily launching the third series of the E-newsletter for the current academic year, I would like to thank my colleagues Prof. Kai-wing Chow, Dr. Catherine Ladds, and Dr. David Schley for serving as the editors in the previous year. As Prof. Chow has just retired, I am very glad to welcome Prof. Stephanie

Po-yin Chung who will be taking over Prof. Chow's editorship this year, and I also thank Dr. Ladds and Dr. Schley for staying in their role in the current year. Moreover, I must thank Mr. Joseph Wing-chung Liu, the Executive Editor, for his excellent work in publishing all ten issues on time each year. Without Joseph's energetic participation, this newsletter could hardly be delivered so timely and so handsomely.

The History Department has completed another fruitful academic year. Our faculty team expanded a bit, bringing in expertise with wider geographical and temporal coverage, and leading to a bigger variety of course choices for students. Besides, the Department achieved great success in external research fund seeking over the past year. Apart from hosting regular activities such as the Annual Assembly, Information Session for Freshmen, Honors Project Briefing, Faculty-Student Consultative Meeting, and Advisory Committee Meeting, the Department also organized/co-organized 8 large-scale events including a database launch, several conferences and fora, and a total of 33 lectures/seminars. Many of our students participated in these activities.

One important development last year is the implementation of the Peer Mentoring Program. We understand that some students may need a little time to adjust to university life, while some may be struggling at different junctures, and others simply would like the support of their peers. Therefore, we appointed ten outstanding students as peer mentors and trained them to offer extra support to students who choose to join the program.

Another significant achievement is the establishment of three important scholarships in the past year. Thanks to the Class of 1985 alumni, a scholarship has been established to commemorate the 30th anniversary of their graduation. Thanks to our supportive alumnus Mr. Yip Sing-kit, a scholarship has also been created to celebrate the happy retirement of Prof. Kai-wing Chow. Another substantial donation of one million arrived in

April 2016 from our long-term supporter Dr. Tan Siu-lin. The Tan scholarship will create 5 awards each year from the 2017-18 academic year onwards, basically serving as admission scholarship but also an effort to push overseas exchanges among scholarship holders.

Moving to the 2016-17 academic year, the biggest event is the Time Capsule Ceremony, in which a century-long time capsule prepared by the Department will be buried at the Baptist University Road Campus Entrance Plaza on October 5, 2016. This is a celebratory event in honor of HKBU's 60th anniversary and SOSOC's 45th anniversary. All serving colleagues and current students, including the Class of 2016, as well as some of our alumni and supporters, will contribute messages, images, and objects to be stored in the time capsule, which is scheduled to be opened in 2116. 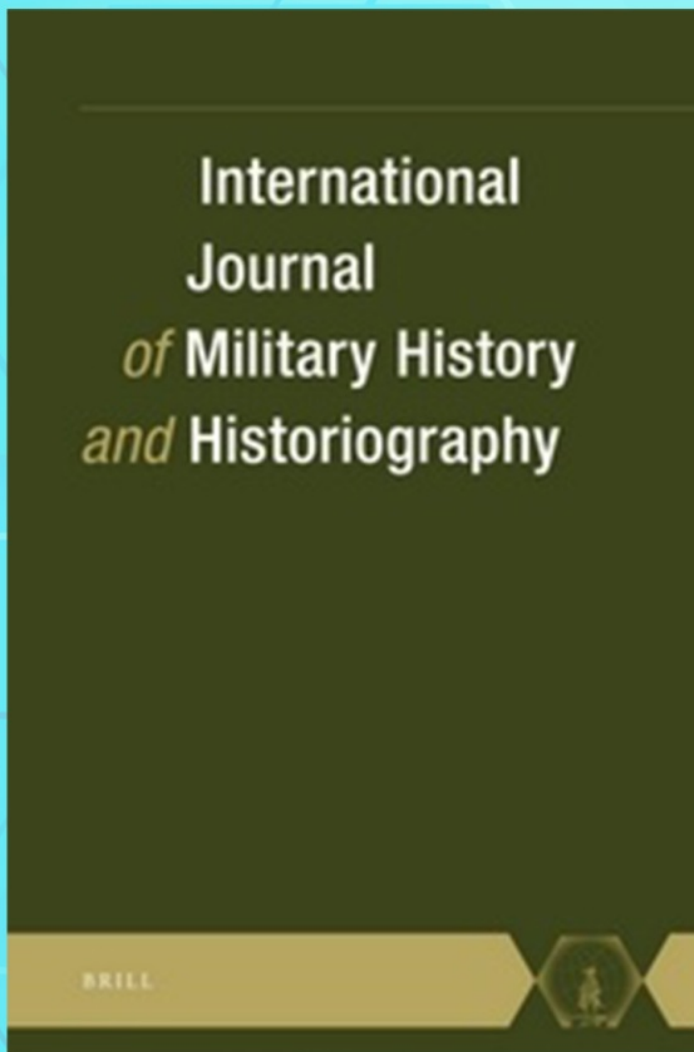

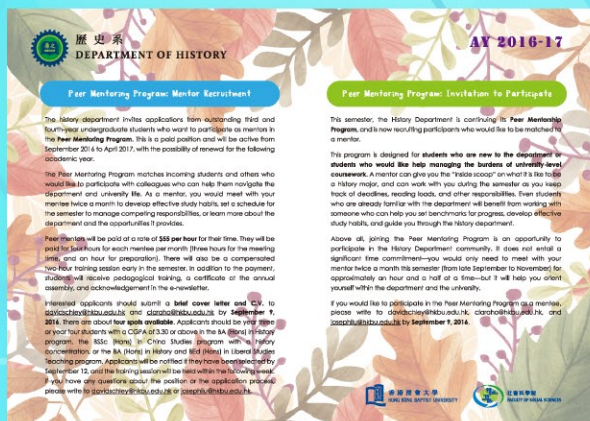
Mr. Chi-fai Lau, a PhD student of the Department, delivered a candidate seminar on his research on “*Dao and Social Changes: A Study of Jian Chaoliang and the Disciples* 儒道與世變——以簡朝亮及其門人為討論中心,” which was organized by the Department and held in the Meeting Room (AAB 1153) on 16 August 2016 (Tue).

Mr. Lau’s presentation attempted to examine the interrelationship and inter-influence between the *dao* (Chinese: “way,” “road,” “path,” “course,” “speech,” or “method”) of Confucianism and traditional Chinese intellectuals during the late Qing and early Republic period. He also focused on the practical use and application of *dao* in daily life by studying Jian Chaoliang’s thought. Moreover, he discussed the development of the *daotong* 道統 (ethical authority), the resistance of *zhengtong* 政統 (political authority), and the dissemination of Confucius *jing* 經 in his presentation.





# Peer Mentoring Program: Training & Information Session (2016.9.21)



The Program is designed to provide support for students who may be new to the department, uncertain how to balance the challenges of academic life, or facing some sort of academic trouble. 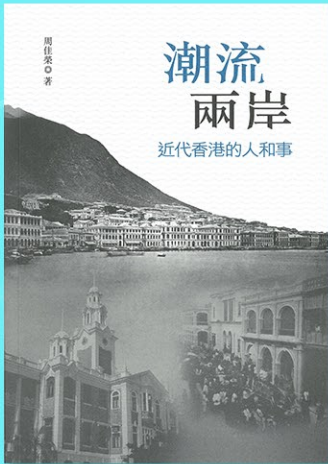

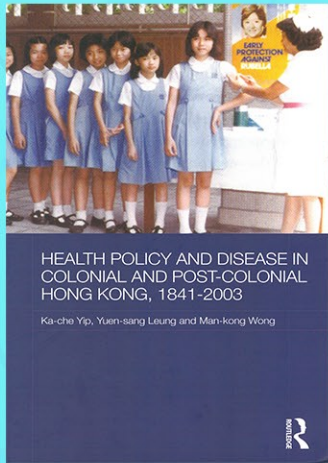

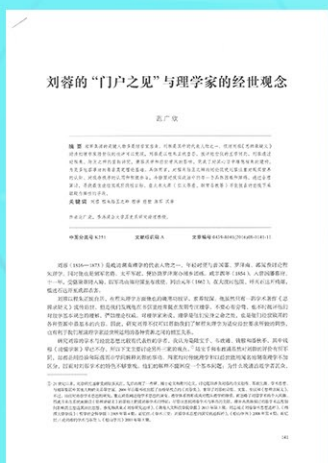

Description:

Besides looking at major outbreaks of diseases and how they were coped with, diseases such as malaria, smallpox, tuberculosis, plague, venereal disease, avian flu and SARS, this book also examines how the successive government regimes in Hong Kong took action to prevent diseases and control potential threats to health. It shows how policies impacted the various Chinese and non-Chinese groups, and

how policies were often formulated as a result of negotiations between these different groups. By considering developments over a long historical period, the book contrasts the different approaches in the periods of colonial rule, Japanese occupation, post-war reconstruction, transition to decolonization, and Hong Kong as Special Administrative Region within the People's Republic of China.

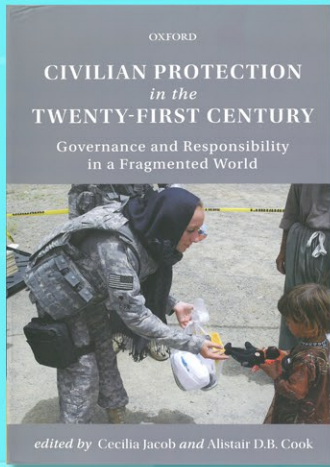

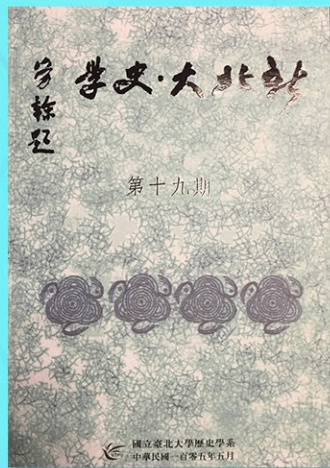
**8 Protection First, Justice Later?**  
Stopping Mass Atrocities in Northern Uganda

Against the background of the international community's failure to stop the 1994 Rwandan genocide, the development of the Responsibility to Protect (R2P) principle and the coming into operation of the International Criminal Court (ICC) in 2002 mark the attempt of the international community to come to grips with the thorny question of how best to respond to mass atrocity crimes, as no universally accepted and effective response mechanism had yet been put in place (Evans 2008). In terms of the international community's response to genocide and mass atrocities, the idea of R2P and the emerging practice of international criminal justice have given birth to two forms of responsibilities: responsibility to protect and responsibility to punish.

Taken together, these two forms of responsibilities can be understood as a change in expectations about international responses to mass atrocities. In hindsight, a major focus of attention in the aftermath of the Rwandan genocide is not the incident itself, but rather how the international community's failure to stop the mass killing in Rwanda has recast the debate on when and how feasible international intervention should be undertaken to stop urgent cases of mass atrocities. Kenneth Wiles (2009: 333) frames these changing expectations as 'the Rwanda effect': the international community's inadequate response to the Rwandan genocide provided the catalyst for the development of the R2P principle and international criminal law, resulting in the creation of judicial institutions for holding perpetrators of mass atrocities accountable.

**清代女性著作中有關養生議題的探討**

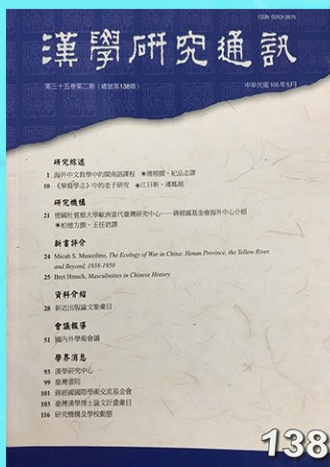
**提要**

清代女作家人數屢豐之冠，據清文獻《清代婦女著作考》指出，此時期的女作家多達三千多人，共創作了極其豐碩的著作數量。與此同時，女性著作的研究引起了學術界的廣泛關注與討論。在文壇上的活躍，亦牽涉不少關於社會、國家等內容，題材廣泛，是珍貴寶貴的參考文獻。在更多的議題下，我們對文字亦難以不是從學術人的共識。女性書寫下「養生」為主題的寫作內容或可從養生、健康、美容等對清代女性著作進行梳理，亦實存發見女性筆下亦涉及不少養生方面的觀念。然而，從女性著作中發掘出有關養生的議題，相關研究尚較為缺乏。當思想與養生觀念並立於社會，亦深受文化、社會影響，內化道德修養等等，當中的議題尤為廣泛；而探究養生思想的重要時期，而此時期女作家亦共同建立了極其豐碩的著作數量，女性著作是具備豐富議題的文獻，梳理其有關養生的議題，除了了解清代女性著作中其豐富內涵或可從養生、健康、美容等對清代女性著作內容的多元性；同時，清代女作家不論身處何種家庭地位的身分，誠然分享其養生經驗與看法，也有助於家務成員加以學習，對家務的整理亦有貢獻。故此建議研究之探討也從家庭教育的視角一談，對家務的整理與傳承之效用亦實不容忽視。

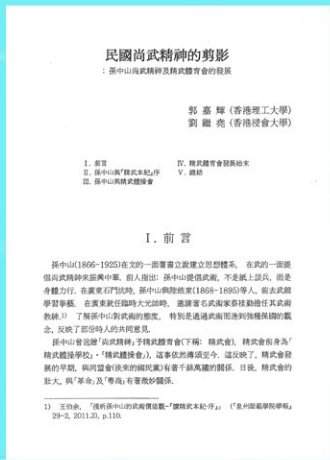

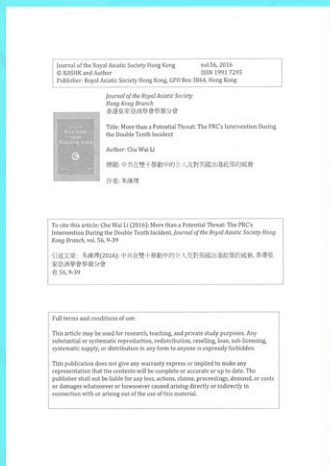

Dear Members of HKBU's Community,

I take this occasion as an opportunity to introduce myself. My name is Oiyan Liu, and I am a new member of the Department of History. Having spent my formative years in Asia, Europe, and the United States, I have developed an interest in the lives of migrants and other itinerants. I am particularly interested in issues concerning race and ethnicity and have come to conclude that such markers are not only invented but also fluid. The ways in which people identify themselves, or are perceived by others, are subject to local, historical, and geopolitical circumstances. Although this conclusion is based on my personal life experiences as an itinerant, my educational background in Southeast Asian history and Chinese history have greatly facilitated this process of realization. In my research and course offerings I touch upon issues of race, ethnicity, nationality, and cross-cultural encounters within the larger framework of colonialism, nationalism, and globalization. My task was to compile a bibliography of secondary sources on the history of New York City and the history of urban traffic, transit, and mobility. My research skills were enhanced through the program. To compile the bibliography, I needed to collect and select scholarly works from several relevant databases. and journal articles published from 1980 to 2000. I found this is a more effective and efficient method to do a literature review. To be honest, the process of the selecting the sources seemed tedious, but it was quite satisfactory when I found the sources I wanted.

The summer research program is a wonderful opportunity for me to get to know how a historian works and starts a new project. It inspired me to steel myself for pursuing the goal of becoming a historian in the future.

This is my second year as a member of the History Department. Like other students, I continue to learn from our teachers through lectures and by developing my interest in History. However, this summer I had an incredible chance to be a Student Research Assistant in our department.

Let me begin with the basic information of the program. I was appointed as a Student Research Assistant to help with the project on Dr. Sun Yat-sen Memorial Parks around the world, funded by the Dr. Sun Yat-sen Research Endowment Fund, which was donated to the History Department by the Luen Thai International Group,





the Tan Siu Lin Foundation and the Sun Yat-sen Education and Charity Foundation. My duties were to examine the existing “Sun Yat-sen Parks in the world” database and provide extra support for the Photo Exhibition of Dr. Sun Yat-sen Memorial Parks around the world which will open in November.

In order to prepare for these tasks, I worked with the current RA, Vincent, to locate more potential historic photos and reports for the exhibition. With his assistance, I examined a great variety of sources throughout the internship. For instance, I made use of archives from different countries, databases and resources from our school and from other universities. Reading the magazines, pictorials and newspapers from the Republican era was the most exciting part. These sources reveal the social life in that era, which is very new to me. Without

doubt, this experience broadened my understanding of research methods and enhanced my research techniques because I exposure to different kinds of historical sources that I was previously unfamiliar with. This is definitely helpful for my study of history in the future.

Instead of just sitting in front of the computer to do research, I went on several field trips to broaden my insight and knowledge. I visited the Hong Kong Museum of History and Hong Kong Heritage Discovery Centre in order to get some inspiration for the design of the Photo Exhibition. Furthermore, I had a valuable chance to visit the Dr. Sun Yat-sen Historical Trail for the first time with Prof. Lee.
