The 2017 Advisory Committee Annual Meeting of the History Department was successfully held in the evening on 5 May 2017 at AAB 1153. The Committee was formed by internal and external members from different fields to give opinions to the development of the Department. Internal members include Prof. Clara Wing-chung Ho (Convener), Prof. Adrian J. Bailey (Ex-officio), Prof. Ricardo King-sang Mak and Prof. Stephanie Po-yin Chung. External members include Ms. Fione Sau-lai Lo (Chairman), Miss Pui-lui Chu, Ms. Qi Gan, Ms. Vivien Lau, Mr. Conrad Lee, Mr. Li Hexie, Dr. Shuk-wah Poon, Mr. Wang-fai Wong, Ms. Rosa Siu-kam Yau and Prof Xu Guoqi. Most of the committee members attended the meeting.



Ms. Fione Sau-lai Lo served as the Chair of the meeting. She expressed her appreciation to committee members for taking their time to attend. Prof. Clara Wing-chung Ho then started to report on recent departmental matters accordingly, such as teaching programmes and student admission, academic, teaching and administrative staff, academic activities, faculty-student relations and the peer mentoring program, scholarship opportunities and completion of the centennial time capsule project.



Committee members noted that the number of scholarships that History majors received was encouraging. Ms Lo invited all members to outreach to different organizations that they are familiar with to provide more scholarships for outstanding students. Some general matters on the development of the Department were discussed during the meeting, including the admission requirements of applicants, teaching languages, support for senior intake students and the possibilities of organizing Day Camp in the Campus during Summer.

By looking at the percentage of students participating in Exchange Programmes, members of the Committee stressed the importance of internships and exchange activities as these are essential for students to gain experiences before entering the job market.



All participants reflected their opinions actively. The Department would like to thank all participants who have shared their valuable comments during their current appointment in the past three years.



## Dr. Catherine S. Ladds Elected as the First Junior Fellow of the Hong Kong Academy of the Humanities

It is a great honour for the Department to report that Dr. Catherine Ladds has been elected to the Hong Kong Academy of the Humanities as a Junior Fellow.

The HKAH was founded in 2011 to support research in the humanities and to promote recognition of the value of humanistic scholarship to Hong Kong culture and society. Furthermore, it aims to assist Hong Kong-based humanists to make international scholarly engagements in Asia and beyond.

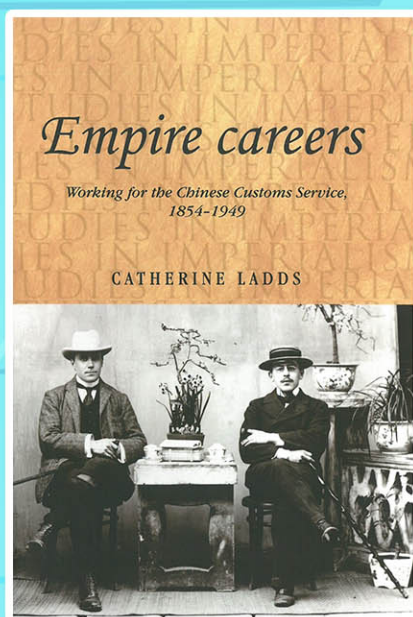
This year the HKAH held its first election of Junior Fellows with the intention of recognizing the research and leadership potential of gifted mid-career humanists in Hong Kong and supporting them to develop into world-class scholars. The HKAH elected Dr. Ladds on the strength of her 2013-14 HKAH First Book Prize, which was awarded for her 2013 monograph, *Empire Careers: Working for the Chinese Customs Service, 1854-1949*.

In becoming a member of the Academy, Dr. Ladds joins ten senior HKBU scholars who are currently HKAH Fellows: Prof. Chen Zhi (JAS), Prof. Stuart Christie (ENG), Prof. John Erni (HMW), Prof. Clara Wing-chung Ho (HIST), Prof. Lo Ping-cheung (REL), Prof. Eva Man (HMW), Prof. Lauren Pfister (REL), Prof. Johnny Poon (MUS), Prof. Douglas Robinson (ENG) and Prof. Zhang Hongsheng (CHI).

The Department would like to express its congratulations to Dr. Ladds for her significant achievement!

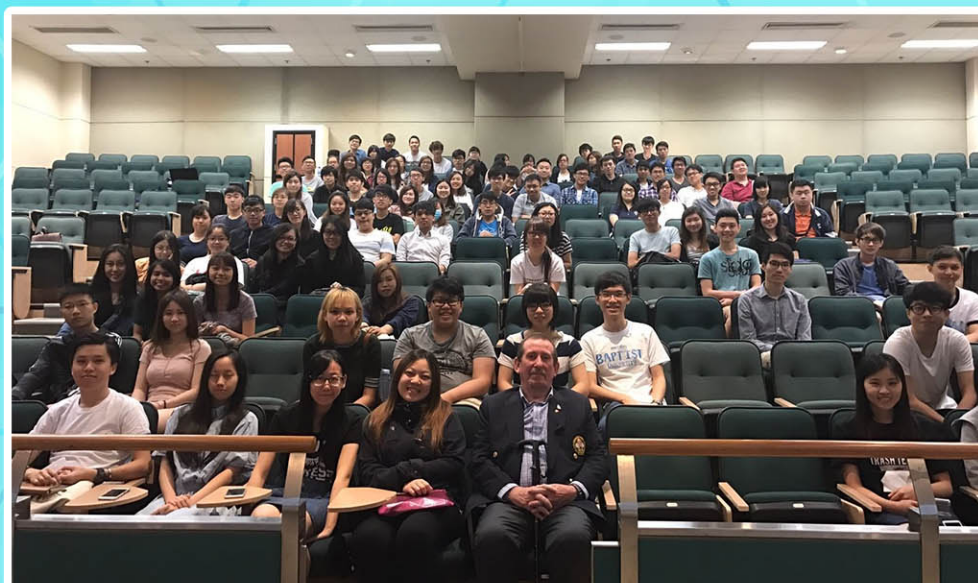
修讀HIST 3106中港時事 (Current Issues in Hong Kong and China) 的同學，分別在3月27日和4月9日參與Refugee Walk活動。當日同學由基督教勵行會社工帶領，考察東南亞在港難民於尖沙咀、油麻地和佐敦的聚集點，包括重慶大廈、聖安德烈堂、九龍佑靈堂、聯合國難民處等地點，最後更探訪了一個位於廟街的難民家庭。同學認識勵行會的運作、在港難民的數字和社會邊緣群體的困境。考察讓同學親身接觸難民，明白他們不能返回原居地、又不能得到西方國家收容、不能工作和上學，停滯在香港沒有身份的無奈。





## GCHC1027 Guest Lecture (2017.4.25)

Mr. Bill Lake 李彪, a British Army veteran, was invited to deliver a guest lecture in Course GC-HC1027 “Modern Military History – China and the West” about his life and experience as a soldier on 25 April 2017. Mr. Lake is a very successful actor, a charity leader and a historian in Hong Kong. Mr. Lake joined the British Army in 1965 and came to Hong Kong in 1968 as a gunner of the Royal Artillery; he played a role in maintaining peace and stability of Hong Kong during a critical period of Hong Kong history. Since the 1970s, Mr. Lake has appeared in hundreds of Hong Kong movies and starred in the movie *Anti-Corruption* in 1975 about police corruption, which featured Hunt and Godber the chief superintendents that escaped Hong Kong. This movie made him a familiar face to a generation of Hong Kongers. He has worked with a variety of distinguished figures of Hong Kong stardom including but not exclusive to Roy Chiao, Patrick Tse, Jackie Chan, and Michelle Yim, et al. His film and television career is a testimony of the growth of the movie and television industries in Hong Kong and of the transformation of the city into an international metropolis.



The talk given by Mr. Lake was not only about conflicts or weapons; it is also about a journey of service, comradeship, and love. His talk also sheds lights on the multifaceted experience of men and women during amidst the overarching historical events such as the “Cold War”. The talk ends with a lively Q & A between “Gweilo Bill” and the students.

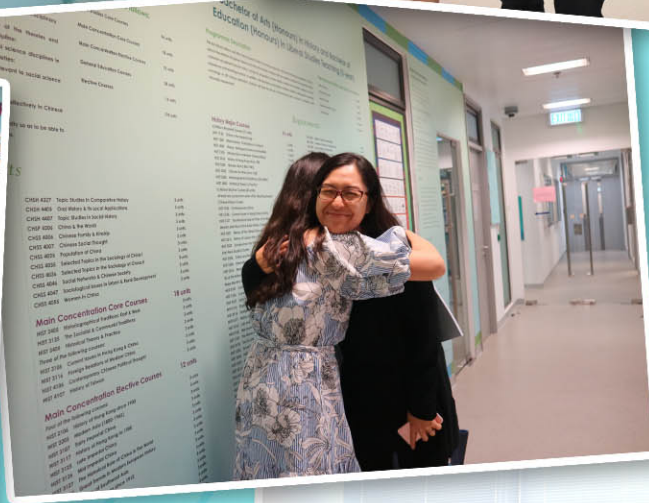

Another round of peer mentors recruitment for the new academic year will be conducted in August.



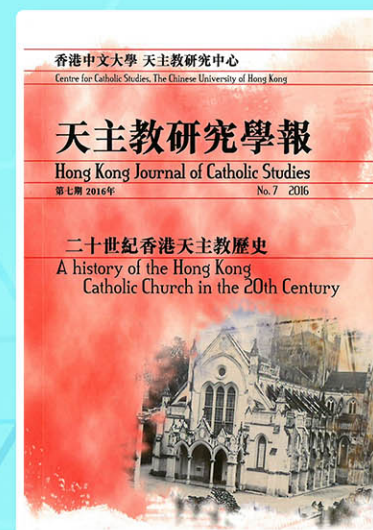

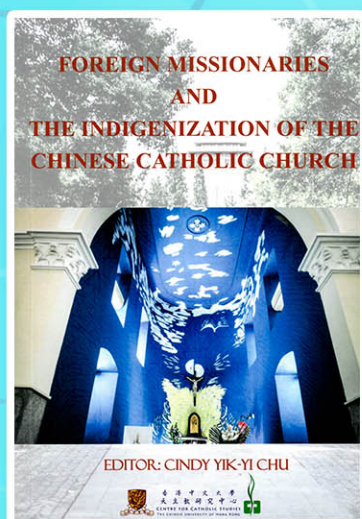

Introduction:

This is a collection of essays on the Catholic Church in modern and contemporary China. It aims to show how the indigenization of the Chinese Catholic Church took place from different perspectives.

## 《歷史係咁話》的前世今生



近日香港電台的港台電視31，逢周一至周五都會播出清談節目系列「五夜講場」。此節目為香港電視史上罕有以文、史、哲為中心的清談節目，目的是讓深夜看電視的觀眾在享受電視娛樂的同時，可以透過各種專家的互動及對本行話題的分享，吸收在商營電視台不會播放的高質學術資訊。當然，製作這種節目時，港台只是負責出「豉油」，而其中的「雞」才是整個節目的關鍵。因此，要推出這個節目，首要條件是先找出那些令人五味交陳，有血有肉有骨，會快速反應又滿腹經綸的學者，才有條件晚晚煮鶴焚琴。本文為大家揭示的，就是逢周二播出的《歷史系咁話》埋班的秘辛。

由於本系前任系主任周佳榮教授及麥勁生教授都是媒體達人，我們一直與本地各大報章與電視台關係匪淺，而前兩年港台將廿世紀六十至九十年代拍攝的舊劇，以歷史資料重新包裝再播的《歷史回望系列》及《光景我城系列》，皆以筆者為主持或重要嘉賓，故此我與他們的製作團隊十分友好。去年暑假某天，擔任多個節目監製的羅志華先生，來到浸大校園跟我談港台未來的節目發展，我就講出我們歷史系的年輕老師、研究生、辦公室人員及畢業生等，在教學較輕省的時段，往往每隔幾周就有校園外的品酒及美食聚會，期間不時會就歷史題目或時事問題捲起衣袖談個風雲變色，也常會你一言我一語的，加入了電影、卡通、俚俗及文學元素，將歷史人物及國家大事來個嘻笑怒罵大翻轉，娛人又娛己。

羅監製偶有參與（及邀請）我與其他同事的歡樂聚會，對小毛、智文及婉嫻等教學上表現出眾的同事更是欣賞有加，因此便跟我商量，何不讓大眾作為旁觀者，在這些學者談天說地講八卦時長長見識。我雖然明白大家吹水時荒誕不經，但總算言之有物，有時也能樂而不淫，不失學者風範，因此便答應認真考慮，並邀請友好成為清談的班底。當時羅先生更說講得歷史，不如文史哲都一併講吧，就此我們繼續討論下去，便有了今天分別是哲學、歷史及文學等三個知識範疇，分三晚各自演繹發展的框架了。





這種清談節目其實相當難做，參與者不只要願意出鏡，也不只要知識淵博，而且更要有風趣一面，說話又要快速清楚，並注意團隊互動。幸好浸大歷史系很多同事本來就是這樣的人，我在當中實在是敬陪末席。我們以浸大團隊為中心，找了本系的畢業生為資料搜集助理，先引入嶺南大學及香港大學與我們有互動經驗的學者，也儘量不以浸大人作最重要的主持，以待節目更成熟時，可邀請更多本地其他大學的史學家來主持或當嘉賓。



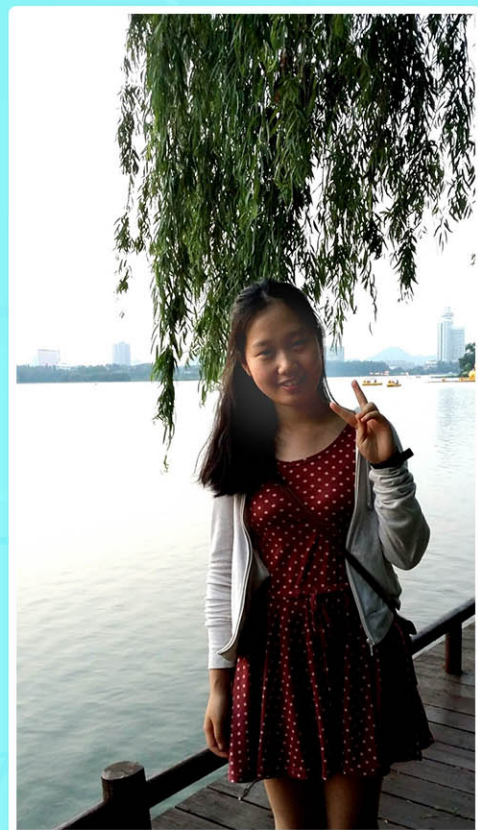

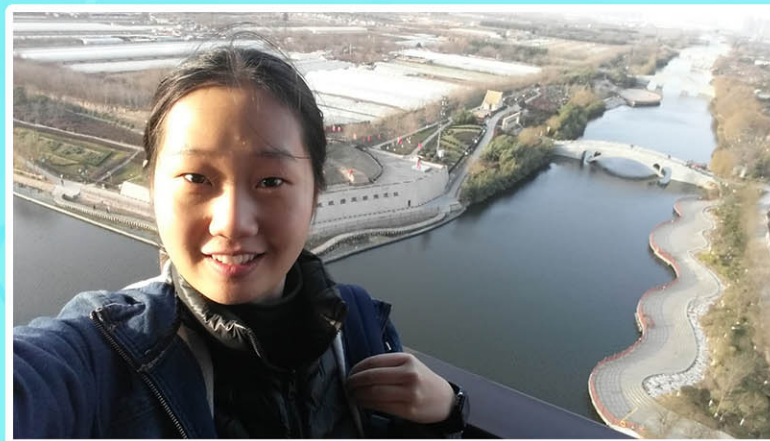
BSSc (Hons) in China Studies- History Concentration, Year 2

**TOPIC STUDIES IN WESTERN HISTORY:  
THE HISTORY OF AUSTRALIA (E)**

This course will explore the history of Australia in the twentieth century, from its origins as a country in 1901 to its engagement with Asia in the later part of the century. It will adopt a political, social, cultural, and intellectual historical approach. Specific topics that will be covered include Federation, the White Australia Policy, the First World War, the interwar years, the Second World War, Post-War Immigration, the rise and demise of Britishness, the 'New Nationalism', the 1967 referendum and Aboriginal rights, the emergence of Multiculturalism, and increasing engagement with Asia. The primary goal of the course is to give students an overview of the fascinating history of this country in the Asia-Pacific region, which has been influenced considerably by external events.
