Text, Artifact and Context: A Workshop on Cultural Practices in Early China

文本、遺物、場景：古代中國文化工作坊 (2017.12.13)



The “Text, Artifact and Context: A Workshop on Cultural Practices in Early China 文本、遺物、場景：古代中國文化工作坊” jointly organized by the Department of History, the Department of Chinese Language and Literature, the Jao Tsung-I Academy of Sinology, and the Mr. Simon Suen and Mrs. Mary Suen Sino-Humanitas Institute was held on 13 December 2017 (Wed) at SWT 501, providing a platform for participants focusing on the research of Early China to share their recent findings and insights.



19 scholars from prestigious institutions in the United States, Canada, Japan, mainland China, Taiwan, and Hong Kong participated in the Workshop. The Workshop consisted of 4 sessions covering diverse topics in Early China, ranging from the study of material cultures, archaeology, art history, to studies of both excavated and transmitted texts.

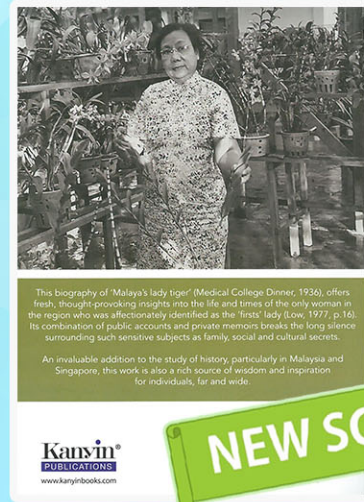
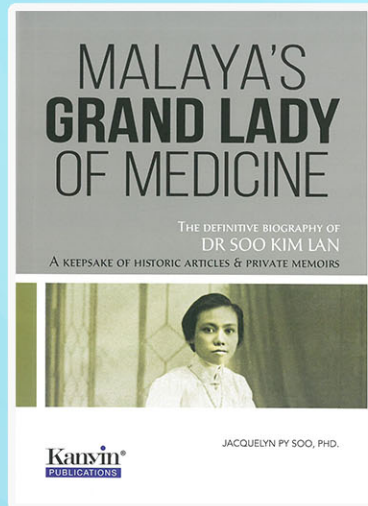
The winner should fulfill the following requirements:

NEW SCHOLARSHIP

The Department is celebrating its 40th Anniversary in 2018. Following the establishment of *The Spring and Autumn Annals* Award & The Herodotus Award, the Department is delighted to announce that it has recently received another donation in commemoration of this exciting moment, and will use it to establish a new scholarship.

The Department is honored to receive a generous donation of HK\$150,000 from our long-term supporter - Dr. Arthur C F Lau, Emeritus Governor, McGill University to establish the “Department of History 40th Anniversary Scholarship: Dr Soo Kim Lan Scholarship” in celebration of the Department’s 40th anniversary in 2018. This scholarship is established by Dr. Arthur C F Lau and Mrs. Crystal Lau-Soo Suit Ching to honor their late mother-in-law/mother, Dr. Soo Kim Lan (蘇金蘭醫生, 1894-1981), who was the first Malayan Chinese female doctor in Malaya. Dr. Soo contributed her entire life to the Public Health and Social Welfare sector and engaged in different charity services. She also devoted herself to educating the young children and became a role model to future generations. To know more about Dr. Soo, please refer to the new book, *Malaya's Grand Lady of Medicine: The Definitive Biography of Dr Soo Kim Lan*, authored by Jacquelyn P Y Soo and published by Kansin Publications in Malaysia, 2017.

Starting from 2018, a Year-3 student in any major programme offered by the History Department who achieved the highest Semester GPA (SGPA) in the first semester of each academic year will receive the award.

MADAM SHAO SHU LUNG MEMORIAL PRIZE (FOR POSTGRADUATE STUDENTS) SHIFTED TO ENDOWMENT 蕭瑞麟女士紀念研究生獎學金升級為永久獎項



In 2008, Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Lee offered to establish a prize in memory of Madam Shao Shu Lung, their late mother-in-law/mother, through a private donation. From 2008 to 2017, nine awards with HK\$2,000 in value have been given to eligible postgraduate students of the Department of History.

An additional donation contributed by the Lee family and the Tsui family, in honor of their late mother-in-law/mother/grandmother, Madam Shao, has been received in December 2017. The sum including the fund balance has shifted to endowment nature.

Starting from 2018, a postgraduate student who is enrolled in the M. Phil. or Ph.D. program at the History Department and has published at least one scholarly article in a well-established refereed journal in the previous year, and has demonstrated outstanding performance in his or her research, will be awarded this prize. The monetary value of the prize will depend on the interest income per year.

蕭瑞麟女士紀念研究生獎學金由李延年伉儷於2008年捐資成立，以紀念李夫人的已故母親蕭瑞麟女士。2008至2017年間，歷史系研究生獲得此獎學金共有九人次，金額為每人港幣二千元。

承蒙蕭女士後人李氏家族及徐氏家族於2017年12月再度慷慨注資，新捐款項將連同既有餘額全數成立留本基金，使本獎項變成永久性質。

由2018年起，註冊修讀哲學碩士或哲學博士之歷史系研究生，如研究成績優異，並於過去一年內曾於聲譽良好及實行來稿送審制度之學術期刊發表論文一篇或以上，將有望成為獎學金得主。獎學金金額按年度基金利息而定。

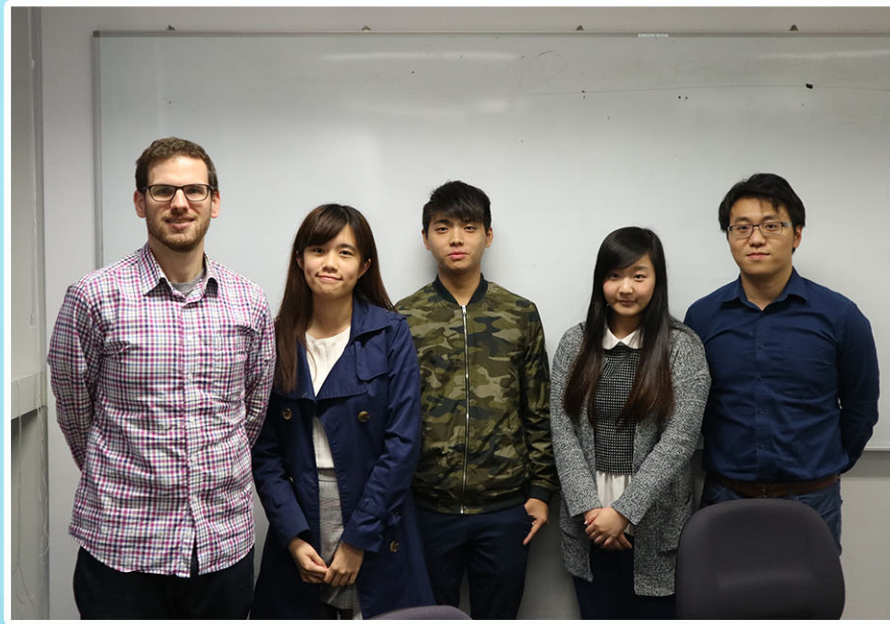
口傳·心授 香港專業精神新書發佈會 (2017.12.2)



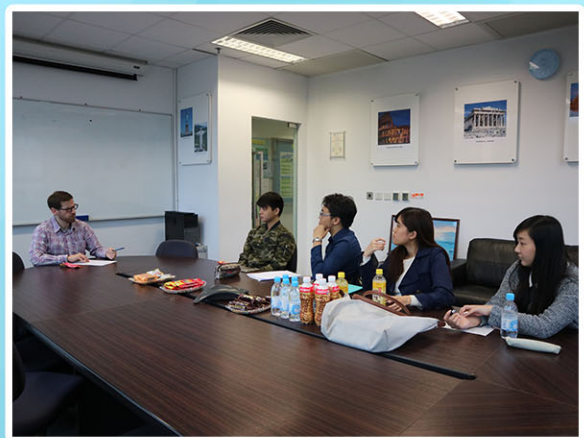

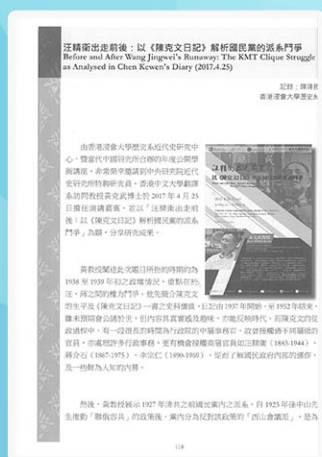

遊學香港日記



不知不覺來到香港快四個月了。抵達時雖說是秋季，但我記得那時拿著行李從巴士車站走到宿舍時已渾身是汗，叫我不禁懷疑這「秋風送爽」的說法，究竟是怎麼一回事。一眨眼如今周遭的人都說香港入冬了。的確這氣溫開始下降，我在戶外走動時，感覺一陣陣冷風吹過，倒接近想像中的秋天。若按照季節更替的自然規律，這十二月至明年華人新年應該是屬於冬天的。可我腦海裡的印象一直還停在秋天，仿佛時間停滯在我初抵香港的那段期間。

這四個月在香港認識了許多新朋友，有來自本地的香港同學，也有不少是來自深圳、廣州、北京、蒙古、湖南等地的中國留學生。和我住同一棟宿舍的也有來自菲律賓、非洲、澳洲的國際學生，但上個月很偶然地，我竟遇上一位來自馬來西亞的女生。依稀記得我如常到宿舍的信箱取信，電梯旁是一位個子嬌小、皮膚黝黑的女生，她聽我說話的口音，便知道我來自新加坡。她告訴她她的房號，卻沒來得及說自己的名字，只說自己是碩士生、過來香港學音樂的。我想，既然是在信箱旁遇見的，那不如就寫一封信給她，並交換名字與聯絡方式，可惜她幾天後就因家裡有事而得回馬來西亞一趟，至今仍未有機會再約。香港無疑是個國際化的城市，但也許生活的步伐有些急促，平日大家一般也總是忙著處理各自的功課或其他事務，相約郊遊聚餐的機會難免較少。所以說有幸結識許多新朋友，還是需要在忙碌之餘抽些時間串門子。那些喜歡在微信裡和我談天說地的，我也很樂意，但始終有些距離感。這虛擬的世界也許很方便，卻不比真實碰面聊天來得親切。

生活在香港，處處都能聽到粵語，例如在外用餐時，服務員一般先以粵語問候或介紹餐廳裡的優惠套餐。買東西、搭小巴、偶爾有推銷員搭訕，也都是以粵語為主，我倒是能聽懂大部分的內容，但回應時則主要以普通話溝通。不時也會有朋友從新加坡過來香港探訪，彼此間則多使用英語交談。歷史系的同學和老師們也很熱心，知道我在學粵語都極為遷就我，往往會使用普通話與我溝通。因此，在香港這幾個月，我的粵語對話未有進步，練習的機會也不多。這倒是激起我應更努力學習粵語的心，待我掌握以粵語進行普通對話，以及適應這寒冬的氣候，亦算是真正融入香港的一種表現吧？

HIST 4215 Topic Studies in Western History: Gender and Sexuality in the United States during the Long Nineteenth Century (E)

Dr. David Schley

Studying the history of gender reveals the manifold ways in which past societies have configured men's and women's roles in society. By examining this history, we can better understand both the ways in which gender norms shape our lives and get a sense of how social orders that appear inevitable or immutable can change. This course undertakes this challenge by focusing on a particular place and time—the United States from independence (1783) to women's suffrage (1920). We will take gender as both a subject of study and a tool of analysis, examining key changes in gender roles and ideology during this dynamic time period and reexamining key moments in American history through a gendered lens. By the end of the semester, students in this course will contribute to our understanding of nineteenth-century American gender and sexuality by producing a research-based term paper on a topic of their choosing.

HIST/CHSH 4327 Topic Studies in Comparative History: The Modern Middle East, 1900-1970 (E)

Dr. Daniel-Joseph MACARTHUR-SEAL

The course provides students with an overview of Middle Eastern history from the last decades of the Ottoman Empire through to the late twentieth century. Students will receive lectures and engage in seminar discussions on historical issues such as Orientalism and the production of knowledge about the Middle East; political reforms in the Ottoman Empire, European mandates, and current nation states of the region, the impact of the First World War, Second World War, and Arab-Israeli Wars; the integration of the Middle East into the world economy, natural resources, and economic nationalism; the rise of nationalist, Islamist and socialist political movements; and changing gender identities and relations.

HIST 4406 Topic Studies in Cultural History: Catholic Sisters in Chinese Communities (E)

Prof. Cindy Yik-yi CHU

This course introduces the Catholic Sisters in Chinese communities, mainly in the twentieth century. It discusses the Sisters' work in education, welfare, and medical care. On the one hand, this course evaluates the contribution of the Sisters (Chinese and non-Chinese) in the local communities of Hong Kong. On the other hand, it assesses the perception of these Sisters from those people whom they had served. This course requires students to read quite an amount of materials so as to engage in group discussions.

HIST/CHSH 4407 Topic Studies in Social History: Social History of Early China (C)

Dr. Ka-lai CHAN

上古（史前到先秦時期）乃中國歷史的黎明階段，上古史更為探索中國文明之源頭。本課程向學生介紹中國上古時代社會生活面貌的情況。課程透過講課、討論、實地考察的方式，讓學生了解古人在環境聚落、婚姻家庭、宗教信仰、天文曆法等方面的生活情況，從社會史角度出發，探索中國上古的發展歷程。
