Happy 2018! This is a special year for the History Department because we are turning forty! To celebrate this occasion, we are planning a host of activities in the coming months. Thanks to several generous donations from supporters, we are proud to have set up four endowment scholarships recently to honor our 40th anniversary, and are expecting at least one more to be established in a few

Chinese Wartime Science Through the Lens of Joseph Needham - Exhibition and Public Lecture (2018.1.22)



The Opening Ceremony of "Chinese Wartime Science Through the Lens of Joseph Needham – Exhibition and Public Lecture" organized by the Joseph Needham Foundation for Science and Civilisation Hong Kong and Needham Research Institute Cambridge, in collaboration with the HKBU Library and the Department of History was held on 22 January 2018 (Mon). This is a rotated exhibition among universities in Hong Kong and Macau.





In the Opening Ceremony, Professor Roland Chin (President and Vice Chancellor), Professor Ricky Wong [Associate Vice-President (Teaching and Learning) cum Academic Registrar], Dr. Peter Lee (Chairman, Joseph Needham Foundation for Science & Civilisation Hong Kong), Prof. Angela Ki-che Leung (Director and Chair Professor of History, Joseph Needham – Philip Mao Professor, Hong Kong Institute for the Humanities and Social Sciences University of Hong Kong), Professor Adrian Bailey (Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences), Prof. Clara Wing-chung Ho (Head and Professor, Department of History), Prof. Kam-wing Fung (School of Chinese, HKU and Executive Director, Joseph Needham Foundation for Science & Civilisation Hong Kong), Mr. Kendall Crilly (HKBU University Librarian), Mrs. Lily Chan (Director, University Advancement Office) and Dr. Melanie Lee (Director, Alumni Affairs Office) served as officiating guests.





Miss Zhihui Lin, PhD student at the History Department, served as the event MC. At the Ceremony, Mr. Crilly delivered a welcome address. He mentioned that the HKBU Library was delighted to work with the Foundation to introduce the great work of Joseph Needham to fellow students. In Dr. Lee's opening speech, he emphasized the impact and contribution of Joseph Needham, and the fact that China had developed its advanced technological power early in history.





Starting from 22 January to 23 February 2018, students are all welcome to visit the Exhibition which documents Needham's first encounter with wartime China. Joseph Needham is one of the most influential scholars in the 20th century, who wrote and edited the landmark history *Science and Civilisation in China*, a multi-volume, comprehensive study of Chinese scientific development and achievement. The exhibition features 11 boards, a short video and Needham's publications for viewers to gain an understanding of the life of Dr. Joseph Needham (1900-1994) and his contribution to the history of science and technology in China.









The Opening Ceremony was followed by a Public Lecture "Joseph Needham's *Science and Civilization in China* and Its Impact on Today's Study of the Chinese History of Science and Technology" by Prof. Angela Ki Che Leung, Director and Chair Professor of History, Joseph Needham – Philip Mao Professor, Hong Kong Institute for the Humanities and Social Sciences University of Hong Kong.

Joseph Needham's *Science and Civilization in China* covered the history of Chinese chemistry, mathematics, biology, mechanics, navigation, medicine, and other disciplines. In the Lecture, Prof. Leung focused on two parts: medicine and food science (completed by Lu Gwei-djen and Huang Hsing-Tsung respectively after Needham's death). The work examined the fundamental differences between Western and Chinese approaches to scientific advancement. According to Prof. Leung, these volumes provide insights to our society today and offer different perspectives for current researchers to look at Chinese history and culture.



由李約瑟科技與文明香港基金會、李約瑟劍橋研究所聯同香港浸會大學圖書館及歷史系舉辦的李約瑟展覽開幕禮於1月22日(星期一)圓滿舉行。該展覽於香港及澳門各大學作巡迴展覽,展示李約瑟這位二十世紀巨人學者的學術成就。

開幕禮的主禮嘉賓包括:香港浸會大學校長錢大康教授、香港浸會大學協理副校長 (教與學)暨教務長黃岳順教授、李約瑟科技與文明香港基金會主席李勵生博士、香港大學歷史系講座教授暨李約瑟-毛奇文基金教授及香港大學香港人文社會研究所所長梁其姿教授、香港浸會大學社會科學院院長貝力行教授、香港浸會大學歷史系系主任劉詠聰教授、香港大學中文學院及李約瑟科技與文明香港基金會總監馮錦榮博士、香港浸會大學圖書館館長Mr. Kendall Crilly、香港浸會大學發展事務處總監陳鄭惠蘭女士及香港浸會大學校友事務處總監李惠儀博士。

由1月22日至2月23日,學生可到圖書館觀賞展覽。李約瑟是20世紀最具影響力的學者之一,其編撰的巨著《中國科技文明史》共有二十多冊,對中國科學發展與成就進行了全面的研究。展覽內容包括11塊展板、一段短片及李氏學術著作,讓觀眾了解李約瑟博士(1900-1994)的生平及其對中國科技史的貢獻。





開幕禮結束後,香港大學歷史系講座教授、李約瑟-毛奇文基金教授及香港大學香港人文社會研究 所所長梁其姿教授主講了一場公開講座,題為「李約瑟的《中國科技文明史》對今天科技史研究 的影響與意義」。

《中國科技文明史》涵蓋了中國在化學、數學、生物、力學、航海及醫學等學科的歷史與發展。在講座中,梁教授重點提到其中兩卷:醫學和食品技術兩部分,它們分別由魯桂珍及黃興宗於李約瑟逝世後完成。這部巨著剖析了中西方科學研究的不同之處,梁教授認為這部書為今天的社會仍不斷提供啟示,並為當前的研究者帶來更多的視角以理解中國的歷史和文化。

Following the establishment of *The Spring and Autumn Annals* Award & The Herodotus Award, and Dr Soo Kim Lan Scholarship, the Department is excited to announce that it has received another generous donation to establish the "Department of History 40th Anniversary Scholarship: Professor Robin D S Yates and Professor Grace S Fong Scholarship" in celebration of the Department's 40th anniversary in 2018. The new scholarship is established by Professor Robin D S Yates [Visiting University Fellow, Department of History, HKBU (2017.8.15 – 2018.1.15)], James McGill Professor, Department of East Asian Studies and Department of History and Classical Studies, McGill University and Professor Grace S Fong (Visiting Professor, School of Chinese, The University of Hong Kong, Professor of Chinese Literature in the Department of East Asian Studies, McGill University).

Starting from 2018, a Year-3 student in any major programmes offered by the History Department who achieved the highest cumulative GPA (CGPA) in the second semester of each academic year, as well as accumulated the highest number of HIST/CHSH course units in Asian and Canadian history will receive the award. In case two or more students obtain the same CGPA and have accumulated the same number of course units in Asian and Canadian history, the Head of Department may exercise his/her discretion to award one student or split the award to recognize more than one student.

The Department welcomes donations to set up further awards under the "Department of History 40th Anniversary Scholarship" category. It is anticipated that more scholarships to commemorate our 40th anniversary will be created from now until the coming year to mark this happy occasion. 
















SOSC AAB Run 2018, New Year Gathering cum Faculty Awards Presentation (2018.1.25)



Reflecting back on my first semester in the Department of History it was certainly a busy one! Some of the highlights included: publishing my first sole-edited book, designing and teaching two courses – pretty much from scratch, applying for a major funding grant, having a journal article accepted and published, working on editing a special issue of a journal, securing a book contract for my next monograph, finishing the Canadian leg of my Global Book Tour for my first monograph in Vancouver, Canada, having two launches of my new edited book in Edmonton, Canada and Hong Kong, presenting my first conference paper in China, and joining the Editorial Board of an academic journal! Several of my academic friends had said to me that your first semester is always hectic and extremely demanding. But I had no idea what they truly meant until I was experiencing it myself. There was a lot to get to grips with. In particular, designing and teaching two courses, essentially from scratch, was quite a challenge. However, it was one that I enjoyed on the whole and I am proud of what I achieved.

My "History of Australia" course especially comes to mind. This was the smaller of my two courses and so I got to know the students individually and there was a great dynamic amongst them. The students of the class impressed me very much, particularly during the tutorials, with their wonderful presentations, great questions, and insightful comments. I have to admit that I was not sure what to expect from the students here in Hong Kong as I had not taught here previously, but I was very impressed with the enthusiasm, engagement, hard work, and dedication of the majority of the students on the course. Teaching the tutorial for the course

I thought it would be nice to take the class out for lunch after the exam for the course as they had worked so hard. And I am very glad that I did, as a lot of fun was had (a photo from the lunch is also below) I am really going to miss the class and hope that I am fortunate enough to have such a wonderful group of students again!



I am also very excited about teaching this semester! I will be teaching a General Education Course on "Eminent Figures in the History of Various Disciplines and Professions". I look forward to designing a new course during the summer on the "History of Canada" (which will be the first time that Canadian history has been taught in the department, and even Hong Kong I believe!) that I intend to teach in the 2018/19 academic year!

♦ Abstract

This paper examines the founding of Hong Kong's Welfare League in 1929, led by a group of prominent Eurasians in the colony, I grave that the founding of this organization was a watershed event in the institutionalization of Eurasian identity in pre-World War II Hong Kong. Prior to this time, many prominent Eurasians in the colony publicly claimed a Chinese identity, both as a means to escape colonial racism and as a means of upward mobility. I argue that an "ethnic shift" took place among Hong Kong's Eurasian community around the time of the formation of the Welfare League, leading many in the younger generation to publicly embrace a "Eurasian" identity. C.G. Anderson (1889-1949) played a leading role in defining a vision of this identity as a founding member of the Welfare League. This paper examines Anderson's vision of "Eurasianness" in relation to broader social changes of the time, and the particular role he imagined Eurasians playing in the fight against colonial racial hierarchies and exclusion.
