校友職業導向分享:從歷史教學走上校長之路

Career Talk by a History Alumna -

The Journey from a History Teacher to a School Principal (2018.4.30)



歷史系校友朱蓓蕾女士撥冗光臨演講,題為「從歷史教學走上校長之路」。朱女士現為嶺南鍾榮光博士紀念中學校長,亦是浸大歷史系顧問委員會成員之一,擁有香港浸會大學歷史文學士學位、香港大學教育文憑、香港科技大學中國研究碩士學位、香港中文大學教育行政與政策碩士學位,也是博士侯選生。朱校長在教育界服務達二十多年,先後歷任教師、副校長及校董,在教授改革、課程統整及與學生溝通方面具備豐富經驗,近年專注德育培訓,亦不時參與其他院校的交流活動。上月三十日,她回到母校為歷史系舉辦的校友職業導向分享擔任講者,與有興趣投身教育界的學弟學妹分享她多年來的寶貴經驗。



朱女士首先從她小時候的志願、成長經歷和學習過程說起,並講述起初成為老師的故事和辛酸。她最大的興趣是任教歷史,但由於當時普遍學校資源不足,每個老師也要身兼多項職務,她便由教中文做起,並主動參與不同的考察和課外活動,即使要奉獻部分私人時間亦不計較。憑著她不怕犧牲和主動投入的精神,慢慢地累積了不同經驗與人脈,亦和學生建立起互信的關係,幾年間便獲晉升至主任級。後來,朱女士在工作上不斷迎接新挑戰,曾服務第二、三派位組別學校,逐步累積經驗,來年即將於第一派位組別學校擔任校長,繼續為教育事業打拼。





朱女士相信教學相長,教學不只是要承傳知識,更要培育學生良好的價值觀及求知的興趣,以生命影響生命。她在繁重的行政工作之餘亦不忘當初教歷史科的使命,只要有時間,她便帶學生到歷史現場親身考察或發掘文物,鼓勵學生主動了解歷史。

朱女士於講座中又與學生分享撰寫個人履歷和準備面試時要注意的事項, 切記要不怕困難, 盡量嘗試。朱女士無私地為學生帶來智慧的分享, 在場學生反應亦十分踴躍, 為這場校友講座添上更溫暖的氣氛。

最後,朱女士勉勵在場的學生不要害怕變化,更不要放棄夢想,因為每個人都有自己的人生時間表,經歷和步伐也不一樣,只要有目標,哪怕所需的時間比較多,也總能走近目標,逐步實現夢想。

Prof. Chow joined the Hong Kong Baptist College in 1980. He was the Head of the Department of History from 1995 to 2009, leading the Department to scale new heights.





An Oral History of Hong Kong Organ Donation and Transplantation Project: Students' Sharing Session 香港器官捐贈及移植口述歷史計劃:學生訪問成果分享會 (2018.5.5)



In the morning of 5 May 2018, nearly 100 student participants gathered at the Council Chamber of HKBU to share their findings in the oral history project on the history of organ donation and transplant in Hong Kong. There were 31 HKBU students, in the class of CHSH/HIST 4405 "Oral History and Its Local Applications," who played a leadership position in their respective oral history teams that were formed in collaboration of senior secondary students from Heep Yunn School, Queen Elizabeth School, and Wa Ying College. It was a profound learning experience for HKBU participants who co-created knowledge about the history and the present state of organ transplant in Hong Kong with their senior secondary student partners. Apart from new knowledge, they gained insights into skills of interpersonal interactions, communication, and time management. There were altogether 18 interviews conducted in March, April, and May. These interviews provided substance for a solid understanding of the origins, the professional practices and procedures, and recent developments of organ donation and transplant in Hong Kong. Students interviewed doctors, organ donors, organ recipients, and a number of professionals who have a key role in organ donation and transplantation.

The event was officiated by Dr. Albert Chau, Vice President (Teaching and Learning) of HKBU, Dr. Kelvin Ho, Founder and Founding President of the Hong Kong Organ Transplant Foundation, and Dr. Cheung Wai-lun JP, Immediate Past Director of Cluster Services Division of Head Office of the Hospital Authority. In their respective speeches, they congratulated the participants for their outstanding achievements in oral history projects, and suggested clues and hints for their further exploration in issues relating to the history of organ transplant in Hong Kong. All the 18 interview groups presented their findings on a wide range of issues relating to the history of organ donation and transplant in Hong Kong. This project is a joint effort of the Hong Kong Organ Transplant Foundation and the Department of History. The Foundation will publish a book to record this history of hitherto unknown stories yet with meaningful lessons that would hopefully promote organ donation and educate the public with a proper view about the practice of organ transplant in Hong Kong.



Another round of peer mentors recruitment for the new academic year will be conducted in August followed by an open-house briefing session for students who are interested in the program.





香港浸會大學歷史系成立於1978年,至今剛好四十年。三十而立,四十就是不惑之年了。況且其前身是浸會學院史地系,自1960年創設時起,即奠定了我校歷史教學的良好根基,前後是一脈相承的。

Excerpts from "Australian Historical Association Early Career Researcher Blog – How To...

Survive in academia until you secure a position (some personal reflections)

by Dr. Jatinder Mann"

I am currently an Assistant Professor in History at the Hong Kong Baptist University (and my teaching portfolio includes a course on the History of Australia). I did my Ph.D. at the University of Sydney in Australia and had two postdocs before I secured myself a tenure-track position in Hong Kong. I was previously a Banting Postdoctoral Fellow (the Canadian equivalent of a Discovery Early Career Researcher Award) at the University of Alberta in Canada. I also undertook a postdoc as a part of a collaborative team project at King's College London in the United Kingdom. I believe it is becoming the norm to have at least one



postdoc before hopefully securing a long-term position in academia. It is certainly very rare for someone to go straight into a lectureship after being awarded their Ph.D. And this is for one main reason I think: the increasing number of history Ph.D.s and so many more people applying for the academic positions advertised, leading to increasing competitiveness.

Although on the surface it may seem that I had a fairly logical career progression, in between the two postdocs and between my Banting Postdoctoral Fellowship and my current tenure-track position I had unpaid fellowships at King's College London. I was certainly grateful for these as they provided me with an important institutional affiliation and office space and resources to continue my research. But the fact that they were unpaid meant I had to primarily rely on savings or pick up some part-time paid work where I could. Although this took some time away from my research and publishing, the need to support myself obviously took precedence. Pursuing a career in academia can be extremely precarious and you may very well find (as I did on several occasions) that you are in unpaid positions. If you can, try to save money when you are in a paid position, for those difficult periods.

As I was thinking about what to write for this blog post I was reminded of an informal Graduate Student Workshop that I gave at Carleton University in Ottawa, Canada last year. The main advice I gave at that, and would like to repeat here for ECRs, is to publish as much of your research as you can (I recall an academic friend and former colleague of mine saying to me soon after being awarded my Ph.D. to 'publish, publish, publish!'). As mentioned above, the academic field is becoming increasingly competitive and so you need to be able to distinguish yourself from the rest of the many other applicants. It is also important to present your work at as many conferences and seminar venues as you can (although I am not sure I would suggest becoming a conference junkie as I have!). Not only will you receive valuable feedback on your research, but it will also provide you with an opportunity to let people know that you exist – raise your profile, and could even lead to potential collaborations. And get teaching experience where you can. In my experience as long as you can demonstrate that you have the ability to teach, that is sufficient...





HIST / CHSH 4135 Topic Studies in Chinese History: Masculinities in Chinese History (C)

Dr. Yu-hin HO

"傳統社會女性為受害者"的觀念已逐漸淡出主流學術界,以女性作為主要分析對象的中國性別史研究,成果甚豐。以性別視角切入研究歷史,有助我們進一步了解歷史。然而,研究性別史必須仔細地考察古代兩性關係及權力分配等議題,例如在中國歷史文化研究的領域之中,我們應重視"男性氣概"、男性的人際關係等課題。事實上,中國男性史的研究已日漸進入學者的視線,足證"男性氣概"的研究深具發展潛力。本課程透過講課及討論的方式,向學生介紹中國"男性氣概"歷史的研究趨勢、研究主題、研究方法及相關史料之探討。課程將分為兩個部分,以專題與史料講授為主要內容,讓各同學可以進一步了解古代男性角色規範、兩性角色期望,對於我們理解中國性別史研究將有極大的啟發性。

HIST 4335 Topic Studies in Global History: History of Canada since 1867 (E)

Dr. Jatinder MANN

This course will explore the history of Canada since 1867, from its origins as a country to its emergence as a multicultural nation in the later part of the twentieth century. It will adopt a political, social, cultural, and intellectual historical approach. Specific topics that will be covered include Confederation, the 1876 Indian Act, the North-West Rebellion of 1885, the White Canada Policy, the First World War, the interwar years, the Second World War, Post-War Immigration, the rise and demise of Britishness, the 'New Nationalism', the 1969 White Paper and Aboriginal rights, and the emergence of Multiculturalism. The primary goal of the course is to give students an overview of the fascinating history of this country in the Asia-Pacific region, which has been influenced considerably by external events.

HIST 4406 Topic Studies in Cultural History: Catholic Sisters in Chinese Communities (E)

Prof. Cindy Yik-vi CHU

This course introduces the Catholic Sisters in Chinese communities, mainly in the twentieth century. It discusses the Sisters' work in education, welfare, and medical care. On the one hand, this course evaluates the contribution of the Sisters (Chinese and non-Chinese) in the local communities of Hong Kong. On the other hand, it assesses the perception of these Sisters from those people whom they had served. This course requires students to read quite an amount of materials so as to engage in group discussions.
