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Wishing you a productive and fruitful AY 2018-2019!



The History Department E-newsletter was launched in the Fall of 2014. In the past four academic years, a total of forty issues have been published. While we are delivering the fifth series of the E-newsletter in the current academic year, I would like to extend my gratitude to Professor Stephanie Po-yin Chung, Dr. Catherine Ladds, Dr. David Schley, Dr. Jatinder Mann, and Dr. Daniel-Joseph MacArthur-Seal for serving as editors in the previous academic year and for staying in their role in the current year. It is also my great pleasure to welcome Dr. Robinson Rebecca to join the editorial team as a new member. Miss Michelle Yan-yue Chan, our Executive Editor, deserves my deepest thanks for her meticulous effort and great efficiency in delivering ten professionally done issues per academic year.

2018 is a very special and important year for the History Department because we are celebrating our 40th anniversary. We started our celebration in January and February with a formal kick-off ceremony, academic events, and a sharing by a distinguished alumna. As soon as we announced our 2018 celebration plan at the commencement of AY 2017-18 we began to invest efforts in fund-raising, with the aim of establishing a series of commemorative scholarships. Now we are truly grateful to report that to date we have successfully raised six new endowment scholarships. The scholarships are grouped under the umbrella title of "Department of History 40th Anniversary Scholarship," but also have individual titles: *The Spring and Autumn Annals Award*, The Herodotus Award, the Dr. Soo Kim Lan Scholarship, the Professor Robin D S Yates and Professor Grace S Fong Scholarship, The Sima Qian and Ban Gu Award, and the Alumna Esther May Wai Wong Scholarship. Moreover, our long-term supporter Dr. Tan Siu Lin, who was conferred Honorary University Fellow by the University in fall 2017, has generously donated another million to our Sun Yat-sen Research Fund, a permanent asset of the Department established by Dr. Tan's continuous donations over the years. We are ever grateful to all of our friends and supporters.

In AY 2017-18, the Department organized/co-organized 7 large-scale events, including conferences, fora, and exhibitions, and over 20 lectures/seminars. Energetic as usual, our faculty members have engaged in nearly 200 individual research activities, including publishing journal articles and books, giving lectures and conference presentations, and serving as panel chairs/discussants. At the moment faculty members are working on a total of 27 funded projects, externally and internally sponsored. The Department is extremely proud that a team of five History colleagues and two external members won a grant of 2 million (maximum-level funding) awarded by the Development Bureau, HKSAR, under the newly launched Built Heritage Conservation Fund. Furthermore, for the first time our historians won a sizable Equipment Matching Fund in order to purchase a

3D scanner, which will be used for various research activities. Three members were successful in the GRF/ECS exercise this year, adding to our proud inventory. The Department's dedicated engagement and productivity in scholarship is illustrated by all these endeavors. We are also delighted to share that a member was elected as a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society, while yet another member won the Faculty Award for Early Career Academic (Research). Moreover, it is very encouraging that one Assistant Professor is promoted to Associate Professor and one Lecturer II is promoted to Lecturer I, both effective on September 1. Congratulations to all of our much-deserved colleagues! Our research students also spare no efforts in publishing and attending conferences. They have achieved a record of 15 publications/presentations in the past year.

Our undergraduate students in all programs continue to work hard and flourish. In AY 2017-18, our students won over 50 scholarships and prizes, which is truly record-breaking. A particularly astounding achievement is that History students swept all the 2017 HKBU Library Awards for Excellence in Undergraduate Research. A significant number of our graduates in recent years got admitted to first-rate universities in North America, Europe, and Australia to further their studies, some on full scholarships. Besides, 23 students participated in exchange programs and studied outside Hong Kong for one or two semesters, while 10 students completed internships at different periods during the past academic year. In accordance with the value the Department places upon students' voices, our Faculty-Student Consultative Meeting was held as usual in April. Moreover, our Peer Mentoring Program operated during both semesters and will continue this year. It is also illuminating that a total of 52 graduates in HKBU's Class of 2018 declared a Minor in History, making us the second most popular Minor program in the university. We witnessed a nearly 30% growth as compared to last year, and the growth is almost 400% if compared to the average figure of the Minor program's first five years since 2009.

In AY 2018-19, we welcome a number of new faces, including two new Research Assistant Professors who bring expertise on environmental history, medical history, and comparative history. We are also happy to host a Visiting Scholar sponsored by the Capital Normal University, who works on the history of middle-period China. Our welcome is also extended to two new graduate students, one on a HKPFS Scholarship and the other on a university studentship, a new teaching assistant, several research assistants, as well as 74 newly declared History Majors in different undergraduate programs, including Senior Year entrants and transferred students.

With new blood joining us, the History family is ever growing with a positive spirit. Another climax of our 40th anniversary celebration will happen in this semester, when we are hosting a series of "Ruby Lectures," as well as some other distinguished lectures, all delivered by internationally renowned scholars. We will co-organize an exhibition with the Library to showcase our journey in the past four decades. Moreover, we will publish a commemorative album, in print and online, to showcase memories of our forty years' journey. Most significantly, we shall host a grand reunion on the evening of December 1. We are very proud to have secured many alumni, past colleagues, and other honorable guests to join the celebration, including but not limited to three former professors who will fly from North America to participate in this occasion. Please stay tuned and check our website often for updates. Looking forward to catching up with our family members of many different generations in December!

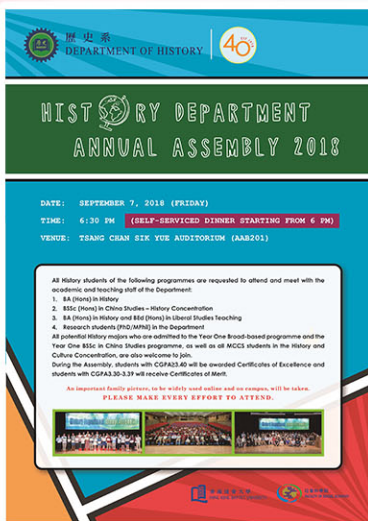

Faculty members of the History Department met students on stage and took turns to share their messages.

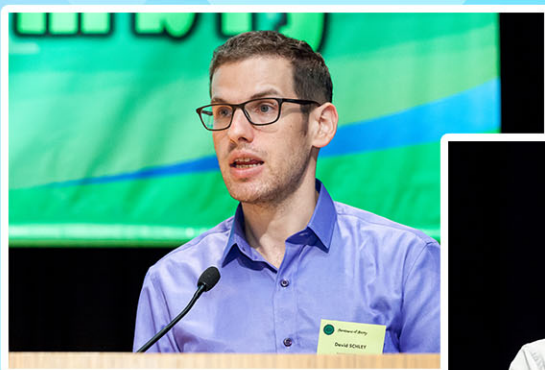
To recognize students' outstanding academic performance in AY 2017-2018, a great number of award certificates were presented to students. These awards included Certificate of Excellence (CGPA at or above 3.40), Certificate of Merit (CGPA of 3.30-3.39), GPA Winner by year, GPA Winner by Programme, Most Improved Award, Good Progress Award and Overall GPA Winner. Apart from certificate recognitions, various scholarships were announced to recognize students' exceptional accomplishments. A total of 88 awardees were recorded this year.



The Department values students with special commitments in the campus or society. Therefore, an email has been sent to students before to call for nominations. Six awardees were selected to receive the Leadership/Service Award.

specializes in the field of European imperial history, especially settler colonialism and the legacies of the imperial past. He delivered a lecture entitled ‘Empires of the Mind’: The Imperial Past in Brexit Britain. The lecture attracted a full house of over 200 audience.



Miss Soo-ei Yap served as the MC of the lecture. First, Dr. Jatinder Mann provided a brief introduction of Prof. Ward. Professor Roland Chin, President and Vice Chancellor of HKBU and Prof. Adrian J. Bailey, Dean of Faculty of Social Sciences presented a souvenir to Prof. Ward on the university's behalf.



As the United Kingdom haggles its way out of the European Union and casts about for alternative futures, it is widely assumed that the imperial past has much to answer for – with Brexit derided variously as a ‘pining for empire’ (Pankaj Mishra); ‘England’s Last Gasp of Empire’ (Ben Judah), and the prelude to ‘Empire 2.0’. This is not just a matter of unrepentant Remainers resorting to easy political put-downs, but also registers in the rhetoric of the Brexiteers themselves.

Prof. Ward discussed from different perspectives in his lecture how we might place the end of empire and Brexit Britain in the same analytical frame, by reconceptualising the idea of Britain and Britishness as global categories of analysis as ideas that were radically adapted to the global dispersal of British people, capital, goods and culture from the 18th to the 20th centuries.

A Q&A session was arranged after the lecture. Dr. Catherine Ladds and Dr. Jatinder Mann served as the moderators.

王院士的主要研究領域為明清到近代的思想史和學術史。借鑒 Robin G. Collingwood 「一切歷史都是思想史」的說法，王院士提倡思想史應該廣泛地與許多領域相結合。他關注思想觀念在實際生活世界中的動態構成，又留心思想世界中多種元素間互相競爭和滲透。

王院士在講座中重訪當代西方思想史不同流派，扼要地論述了自二十世紀以來西方史學界對思想史研究的趨向及各種範式轉移，檢視觀念史派、概念史派、心態史派以及甚具影響力的「劍橋政治思想史學派」之貢獻。

王院士首先從戰前英國的「觀念史」(history of ideas)談起，指出Arthor Lovejoy因深受分析化學的影響將「觀念單元」(unit-idea)視作思想史的基石。與此不同，戰後法國的年鑒學派則致力於「心態史」(history of mentality)的考察，關注普通民眾的精神活動與價值結構。王院士以「法國16世紀的不信問題」為例，闡述了心態史研究是如何從定量分析中得出定性結論。

最後，王院士以方東樹的《漢學商兌》為例，闡明他自己對研治思想史的一點反思，強調應將義理、考證、虛、實、靜態的傳統及動態的環境結合起來進行分析考察。

講座後的問答環節由周佳榮教授及李建深博士主持，學生們踴躍發問。

The Department of History presented the second Ruby Lecture on 18 September. Prof. Fan-sen Wang, Distinguished Research Fellow and former Vice-President of the Academia Sinica, delivered a lecture on the conceptualization of intellectual history in the light of various schools developed in the Western academia. The lecture attracted a full house of over 270 audience.

Prof. Wang revisited various theories in the field and discussed the contribution of scholars in subfields such as conceptual history, history of ideas, history of mentalities, and especially the influential Cambridge school advocating the history of political thought.

王德威院士以華夷這個在中華文化當中非常重要的概念，帶出近年來為華人學術界帶來很多迴響的理論例如華語語系研究。王院士首先按歷史時序分析了從先秦至近代的華夷觀念如何演變，指出到了近代的華夷概念不再是定於「一尊」，而是因應政治局勢而變得「浮動」，藉此解釋近年來很多關於中華民族、中國的理論，背後都蘊含着不同的政治意識形態，而且各走極端。

王院士重申歷史脈絡的重要性，精確地指出華語語系文學研究的前景。有異於其他以後殖民主義理論及後帝國主義理論研究華語語系文學的學者，王院士認為有關課題的研究必須加強歷史的面向，才能取得更有突破性成果。最後王院士以他的「華夷風」概念作結，呼籲大家以理性、依「歷史」來看待中華民族概念的討論。

問答環節由劉詠聰教授及張宏生教授共同主持。由於王院士知名度極高，不少慕名而來的公眾人士及出席的學生都在活動結束後紛紛要求合照並索取簽名。



The Department of History, the Department of Chinese Language and Literature and the Mr. Simon Suen and Mrs. Mary Suen Sino-Humanitas Institute jointly presented a distinguished lecture on 19 September, delivered by Prof. David Der-wei Wang, Edward C. Henderson Professor of Chinese and Comparative Literature, Department of East Asian Languages and Civilizations, Harvard University, an internationally renowned scholar and a major leader in the field of Sinophone literature. Over 350 audiences members participated in this full-house event.

Prof. Wang shared his insights on the topic “Sinophone/Xinophone Studies: New Horizons of Chinese Studies”. In contrast to some scholars in the field of Sinophone studies who are more inclined to apply theories of post-colonialism and post-imperialism, Prof. Wang advocates the importance of historical perspectives in order to yield more fruitful research.



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PEER MENTORING PROGRAM: MENTOR RECRUITMENT

The History Department invites applications from outstanding third and fourth-year undergraduate students who want to participate as mentors in the Peer Mentoring Program. This is a paid position and will be active from September 2018 to April 2019, with the possibility of renewal for the following academic year. Mentors will take a leadership role within the department by working with your fellow students and contributing to department events.

The Peer Mentoring Program matches incoming students and others who would like to participate with colleagues who can help them navigate the department and university life. You will meet with your mentee at least once in person, and may thereafter communicate by Whatsapp. As a mentor, you would help your mentee by answering their questions about the department, working with them to develop effective study habits, and assisting them as they adjust to university life. You may also have the chance to volunteer to assist the department at important events and functions throughout the academic year.

Mentors who are matched with a mentee will be paid \$800 per academic year, along with an additional \$55 per hour for time spent on departmental events. There will be a two-hour training session early in the semester. In addition to the payment, students will receive pedagogical training, a certificate, and acknowledgement in the e-newsletter.

Applicants should be year three or year four students with a CGPA of 3.30 or above in the BA (Hons) in History program, the BSSc (Hons) in China Studies program with a history concentration, or the BA (Hons) in History and BEd (Hons) in Liberal Studies Teaching program. Applicants will be notified if they have been selected by September 15, and the training session will be held within the following week. 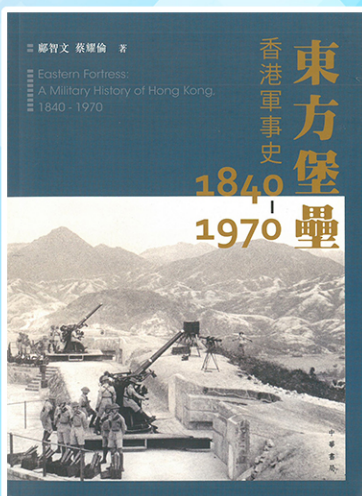
簡介：

早於1857年，英軍就已招募華人入伍擔任後勤工作。19世紀末，香港陸續出現了華人水兵、水雷砲兵與勞工隊，其角色已有不同。二戰時，華籍英兵廣泛參與，除了為人熟知的英軍服務團外，還有香港保衛戰中的砲兵、工兵、華人軍團、防衛軍，以及緬甸戰場的特種部隊香港志願連等。戰後，華籍英兵仍一直協助香港防務。直到1997年，其身份才隨殖民地時代的結束而成為歷史印記。本書不只是為重新發現「本土軍人」，回顧這段被人遺忘的香港歷史，更希望從華籍英兵的角度，審視英國殖民者與香港華人的關係。

香港除了是知名的貿易港，也是英國的「東方堡壘」。許多人把這個殖民地與直布羅托和馬耳他相提並論，它是大英帝國戰略中關鍵卻又脆弱的環節，在紛亂的歲月接二連三受到敵人威脅。本書檢視香港在大英帝國防衛體系中不斷發展的角色，來自俄國、法國、美國、德國、日本和其他國家此起彼伏的挑戰，以及二次大戰前一段時間的防務準備。書中有一章論述1941年日本侵略這個殖民地時爆發的香港戰役，為這場戰事提供新的解讀。其餘各章探索香港在冷戰時期迭經變化的戰略角色，以及軍事實力的逐漸減弱。本書不但集中於政策和事件，還探討香港駐軍的日常生活，軍方和文人政府之間的鬥爭，以及武裝部隊和平民之間的關係。

這是首個有關香港防衛的全面研究，涵蓋殖民時代初期至1970年英國結束在蘇伊士運河以東地區的軍事利益，書中採用了來自世界各地的檔案的原創研究，包括英文、日文和中文資源。書中並附有多幅詳細地圖，供歷史學者和軍事愛好者研究。

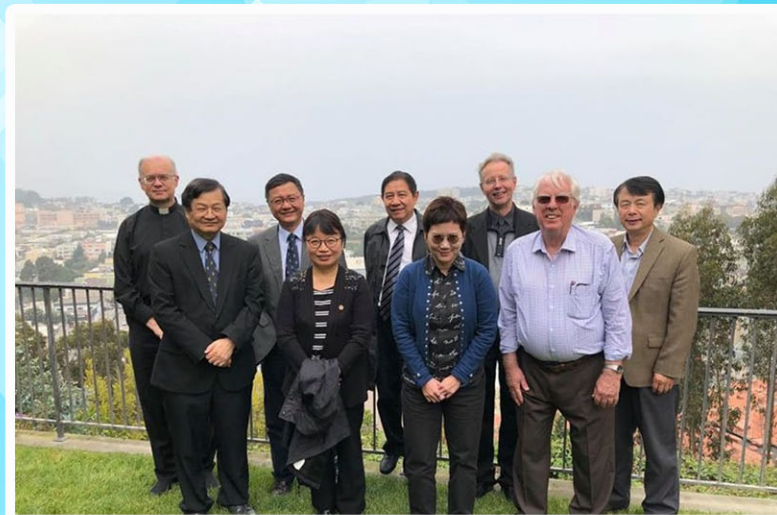

While ancient history may not seem to be the most important topic to study in today's fast-paced world, I think it's important to look at human history from the perspective of the *longue durée* – to see how the ideas and institutions of the intellectuals, statesmen, generals, and artists of the ancient world shaped not only their societies, but ours as well.

Two years ago, I visited Hong Kong for the first time for a conference at the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, and immediately became enamoured with the city's bustling streets, the many green and mountainous spaces, and the diversity of people, cultures, and food. I am looking forward to exploring the city and its rich history with my students and colleagues, and I am proud to now call Hong Kong my home.

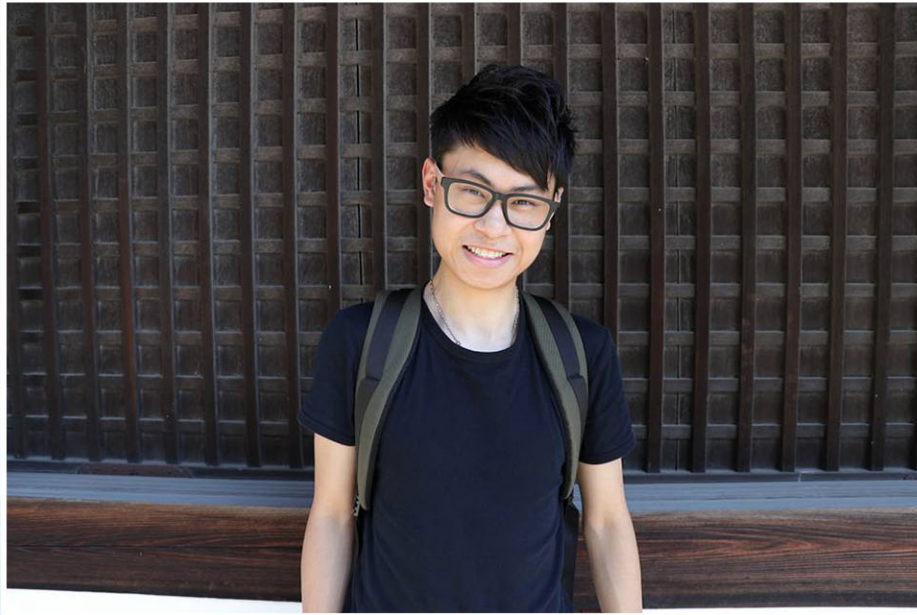

Abstract

More than 40 years afterwards, the massacre on October 6, 1976, at Thammasat University in Bangkok remains deeply traumatic and enigmatic to Thai society. Many factors, including the state's suppression and censorship, shame, guilt, and historical ideology, have contributed to the limited discourse about the massacre over four decades. But silence is not forgetting. It is the unforgetting. The story of the massacre and its unforgetting reminds us how cruel history can be, yet how essential it is in dealing with the traumatic past.

Abstract

Global History and Women's and Gender History are two comparatively recent subfields whose paths increasingly cross. Historians have long grounded their research in the study of empires, kingdoms, and nations though recently some have turned to look at global processes and interactions, including wars, cross-border expansion, trade, technology transfers, world religions, and cultural exchange—to name a few. U.S. pioneers in the field have found the history of women ill-suited for inclusion in the world or global history enterprise. The charge is that they did not cross borders in trade, warfare, exploration, and the global spread of religions. Instead they sat at home. Even in developing the basic world history curriculum there has been a decided bias against the inclusion of women. It was said that world history was about "big" processes and global figures, so that Mohandas Gandhi could appear in textbooks but individual women's rights activists could not. My presentation will discuss the integration of women into world history and the history of women. More to the point, the presentation explores new insights into historical narrative to be garnered from this enterprise.

Abstract

This talk will look at the interconnections between the conflicts that took place in different parts of the world during the final year of the nineteenth century. 1900 saw not only the Boxer Crisis in China but also the continuation of the Boer War in South Africa and the Tagalog rebellion in the Philippines that was suppressed by American troops. When these events were taking place, many people saw them as interconnected or worth comparing and contrasting with each other, but since then each has often been treated on its own. This presentation will explore what we can learn by placing them side by side and thinking about the era around 1900 as a time, like the present period, when the global order was undergoing dramatic shifts.

1893年9月在美國芝加哥召開的「世界宗教大會」是一個重要的現代性事件，它衝擊著世界各種傳統宗教。日本佛教徒對於這一現代潮流早有準備，在會議上應對自如，說明日本佛教已經走出明治初年「祭政一致」和「神佛分離」造成的困境。但是，與日本不同，代表中國出席大會的主要是西洋各國在中國的傳教士，唯一一個真正與會的中國人彭光譽，則以帝國官員與儒家學者身份，傲慢地堅持儒家政治制度和意識形態，對「宗教」與「現代」都表現出相當不屑。中國佛教不僅缺席大會，並且在那個時期，對現代潮流也缺乏回應。正是由於中國佛教的反應遲緩，使後起的中國佛教不得不面對居士佛學的挑戰、現代政治和思潮的壓力和日本佛教爭奪空間的三重壓力，使得二十世紀上半葉中國佛教舉步維艱。對比日本佛教與中國佛教的這一現代歷史過程，可以讓我們重新思考有關東亞、宗教與歷史的問題，檢討有關這一領域研究的理論和方法。

Abstract

For thousands of years cities have been at the center of wide networks of trade and politics. It was not until the Spanish arrived in the Americas in the 16th century, however, that the circuit of commerce linked the eastern and western hemispheres together into one world. Historians have sited the origins of modernity in that global epoch, most often tracing its origins to the nation states that patrolled the North Atlantic. Based on the presumption that history is not made just in the national capitals of Western Europe, I have examined global history from an urban location along the Pacific. Starting along San Francisco Bay around 1800 I propose to show how events in cities had global consequences. By exercising municipal sovereignty, cities could circumvent and even superseded the federal government of the United States. I will argue that the creation of a city along San Francisco Bay had global consequences, including the advancement of both democracy and capitalism. Even before the Gold Rush in 1849 the ports of San Francisco and Canton were trading partners. Although the connection between San Francisco and Hong Kong is more of a stretch, about which I have only superficial knowledge, I will propose in conclusion that it is an opportunity to think together about those promises and perils of globalization that confront both cities in the 21st Century.

Abstract

Chinese printing technology—both xylography and movable type—had produced rich and heterogeneous print cultures in imperial China, Asia, the Middle East, and Europe. The versatile woodblock technology by virtue of its technological singularity and operational simplicity had facilitated not only the spread of printing technology itself in China and beyond, but also the formation of a unique book culture as well as a society where prints were extensively used in important aspects of life in imperial China.

Biography

Professor Kai-wing Chow was born in Hong Kong in 1951. He graduated from Hong Kong Baptist College in 1976. He earned a Master's degree in history from the New Asia Institute of Advanced Studies (香港新亞研究所) and a Ph.D. in history from the University of California, Davis. He joined the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign (UIUC) faculty after graduation in 1988. Currently he holds a professorship in the Department of East Asian Languages and Cultures, History, and the Program of Medieval Studies. He is also a Curator of the Spurlock Museum (UIUC). His research interests include the history of thought, print culture, ritual, religion, lineage, legal and public culture of China from the tenth through the early twentieth century. He has authored and edited six books and over 30 articles on Chinese thought, identities, print culture, and ritual. The Korean translation of his book, *The Rise of Confucian Ritualism in Late Imperial China: Ethics, Classics, and Lineage Discourse* (Stanford: Stanford University Press, 1994) was selected by the National Academy of Sciences of South Korea as one of the Outstanding Scholarly Books of 2014. The Chinese edition is published in 2018 as a volume in the Translation Series of the Chinese National Committee on Qing History. He has received numerous grants from foundations and funding agencies, including NEH, ACLS, National Academy of Sciences, Center of Chinese Studies (Taiwan) and the Chiang-Ching Kuo Foundation. He has organized several major international conferences on Chinese history, the most recent one being "Reading without Books: Experiences of Print in Everyday Life in Imperial China, Tang (618-907) through Qing (1644-1911)" (University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, September 26-27, 2014). He was elected President of the Midwest Conference on Asian Affairs in 2014.
