The Department's Second QEF Project Won by Dr. Kin-sum (Sammy) Li and His Team for Teaching Chinese History with 3D Models of Artifacts

李建深博士及其團隊獲優質教育基金撥款利用3D掃描技術製作中國歷史教學教材



The Department is extremely proud to announce that a team led by Dr. Kin-sum (Sammy) Li, Assistant Professor of the Department of History, received HK\$1,353,100 from the Quality Education Fund (QEF) to develop a set of teaching materials in art history by utilizing a 3D-scanning technology to reproduce 3D models of artifacts in the Art Museum at CUHK. Members of Dr Li's team include Dr Tam Ka-chai, Dr Fan Wing-chung, Dr. Kwok Kam-chau and Dr. Law Yuen-han.

There is a lack of content when it comes to studying art history and archeology in Hong Kong, students have few visual resources that can help them learn about the ancient art history of periods such as the Pre-Qin and the Six Dynasties. By utilizing innovative technology, students will be given the chance to access virtual artifacts, analyze historical literature and antiquities, and explore new fields in history. The team will also organize workshops for local school teachers, primary and secondary students, as well as students with special needs to integrate themselves into different knowledge of teaching and learning in STEM, History and other subjects.

由李建深博士領導的團隊，獲優質教育基金撥款港幣135萬多元，支持他們利用3D掃描技術將香港中文大學文物館的多件文物製作網上3D文物模型，配合中國歷史科課程大綱從而制訂新教材。該計劃的團隊成員包括譚家齊博士、范永聰博士、郭錦洲博士以及羅婉嫻博士。由於香港的歷史文化教育較缺乏藝術史和考古方面的內容，導致學生在學習古代史如先秦與魏晉南北朝藝術史時未能透過直觀的器物學習。研究團隊於是希望利用創新科技突破時空限制，重現歷史文物，讓學生接觸這些器物並學習分析歷史文獻，開拓學習歷史的新領域。研究團隊亦會為本地學校的老師、中小學生及有特殊學習需要的學生舉辦工作坊，提升老師的專業教學能力之餘，也讓學生將STEM、歷史及其他學科的知識融滙貫通。

The Department Succeeded in Obtaining the Research Matching Grant Scheme (RMGS)

The Research Matching Grant Scheme (RMGS) launched by the HKSAR Government is designed to incentivize the private sector to strengthen financial support for research and development and to diversify research funding sources of the higher education sector. Under this scheme, the Government has earmarked a matching grant of HK\$3 billion for application on a first-come, first-served basis by 8 UGC-funded universities and 13 local self-financing degree-awarding institutions. This is a “dollar-for-dollar” matching and it enables the research project to receive 100% of the matched amount.

With the recent \$1M donation from our long-term supporter Dr. Tan Siu Lin on research projects and activities related to Sun Yat-sen, the Department proudly announced that it has completed the application for RMGS and has successfully attained a 100% matching with such generous donation. A big thank you to Dr. Tan Siu Lin for his recurrent support. Members of the Sun Yat-sen research team include Prof. Clara Wing-chung Ho (PI), Dr. Daniel Kam-chau Kwok (Co-I), Dr. Raymond Kwun-sun Lau (Co-I), and Mr. Vincent Chung-hang Ho (RA). It is foreseeable that more fruitful research outcomes will be produced.

Research Matching Grant Scheme Opens for Application with effect from 1 August 2019

The Government has earmarked \$3 billion as matching grants under the Research Matching Grant Scheme (Research MGS) designated for research-related purposes with no restriction on any academic discipline. The Research MGS will be open for applications throughout a period of three years from 1 August 2019 to 31 July 2022 by local degree-awarding institutions (including UGC-funded universities as well as self-financing institutions) listed at [Annex](#) below.

Donations / research funding from non-government / non-public sectors (regardless whether they are from Hong Kong or non-local funding sources) as received by local degree-awarding institutions listed at [Annex](#) below will be eligible for matching grants under the Research MGS.

The operation guide together with a set of Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) have been uploaded onto the UGC website (https://www.ugc.edu.hk/eng/rgc/funding_opport/rmgs.html) for reference. Applicant universities / institutions are advised to read the application details as set out in the operation guide carefully before completing the application forms.



Dr. Kam-chau Kwok (PI) and Prof. Stephanie Po-yin Chung (Co-I) Won a Service-Learning Mini- Grant of HK\$60,000

Congratulations! Dr. Kam-chau Kwok, in collaboration with Prof. Stephanie Po-yin Chung, successfully won a mini-grant of HK\$60,000 offered by the Centre for Innovative Service- Learning to support activities of his course HIST 3106 Current Issues in Hong Kong. The dedicated theme is Rural-Urban Development. Students will be given the chance to observe rural-urban development through the lens of Pokfulam village.

Located at the western end of Hong Kong Island and surrounded by buildings, Pokfulam village had been facing pressure of urbanization. To protect their home, villagers pay much effort to revitalize historical sites and organize festivals to attract visitors.

Dr. Kwok will lead his students to Pokfulam village and support it as a sustainable community by serving as volunteers. They will be creating traditional art crafts, tourist boards and postcards, and writing introductions for the valued historical sites. These help promote the village and teach the next generation to conserve their own culture.



Dr. David SCHLEY 帥德威博士



Recently I attended a conference hosted at the University of Hong Kong called “Nineteenth-Century Formations.” Scholars working in literary studies, political science, history, and art history from Hong Kong and around the world gathered for the occasion. We had different topics, different areas of specialization, different methodologies, and different languages, yet we shared a focus on this formative period in world history. It was striking to hear how, for example, the construction of gender in British novels paralleled performances of femininity in Chinese mirror boxes, or how the privileging of so-called “free trade” dovetailed with efforts to remake cities as sites of circulation.

Of course, on one level, this should come as no surprise: in the nineteenth century the threads of trade, communication, culture, warfare, and exploitation that had gradually knitted the world together since the fifteenth century became entangled in new and unprecedentedly dense ways. The barriers that we erect as scholars between fields of inquiry or geographies of focus do not reflect the intertwined lives that people live, then or now. This does not mean that we should abandon our specialized fields. It takes time and expertise to understand a particular place, a particular question. If we widen the scope of our inquiry too far we fall into ill-informed generalizations. The point, rather, is that conferences like this one afford us opportunities to see through those divisions and make productive new connections.

HIST 4406

Topic Studies in Cultural History: The Manchu Qing: Culture, Religion, and Science (E)

This is a course in the history of culture, religion, and science of the Qing Manchu empire (1644-1911). It will first introduce students to the role of the Manchu rulers' Inner Asian ethnicity in their rule of the Qing empire. We will then go on to think about how the Manchu emperors' ethnicity played a special role in the practice of religion, such as in their patronage of Tibetan Buddhism. Next, the course will introduce students to the practice of science and medicine at the court and beyond. In this respect, the course will seek to place Qing religion and science in the wider, transnational context of what has been called the first global age.

3. Department of History Peer Mentoring Program




