

some of what you will read is my own conjecture and invention. Here I have followed a central tenet of Chinese historical writing, which strives to bring to life people from the past with their feelings, words, and deeds intact. My comments as the historian, which follow each section and fill the notes as well as the epilogue that concludes the book, feebly attempt to honor both the style and the critical standards set nearly two millennia ago by the great Han historian Sima Qian, who kept his lively historical narratives and his personal judgments separate.

Tang Yaoqing's life began in the town of Changzhou in southeastern China, one of two flourishing centers for women's learning in the Qing period, and an intellectual hub of the empire. 102 She died far from home, in a remote

Wang Caipin's life, like that of her employer, Xu Zhenyi, was framed by the millenarian movement known as the Taiping Rebellion. From its modest stirrings in 1851 far to the south of Caipin's home, the movement swept into the Lower Yangzi region and occupied it for more than a decade. The Taiping were not fully defeated until 1866, when their self-proclaimed "Heavenly Kingdom" collapsed. The rebellion shocked people like Wang Caipin

Wang Caipin's life after her marriage is retrieved only in snapshots like the ones presented here: occasional poems, linked to a date or an event, that enable us to place her in space and time, and to try to locate there some-
